
A reading from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians (12:3b-7,12-13)

On June 19th, 1821, Pope Pius VII established the Diocese of Cincinnati and named Bishop Edward Fenwick O.P. as the first bishop of the diocese. Bishop Fenwick a Dominican friar was joined by six Dominican priests to begin shepherding the Catholic pioneer families already in the region and to begin to share the faith in Christ and His Church with others. Throughout the first two hundred years the Archdiocese of Cincinnati has handed on faith in Jesus Christ to many generations of the faithful. We stand on the shoulders of those who have come before us. The diocese started out with just a few missionary parishes. Throughout the history of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati many parish churches have been established. We currently have a system of 210 parishes handing on faith in Jesus Christ and His Church to the next generation. The Partial Indulgence to be granted during the Bicentennial of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati.

Bicentennial Indulgence

The faithful of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati are able to be granted a Partial Indulgence during this bicentennial year of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati.

Since it is a partial indulgence, the required conditions are simply to pray as indicated in the decree for the needs of the Archdiocese and for all her members, especially for unity and charity. The person seeking the indulgence has to be in the state of grace (not conscious of any mortal sin) as they do that and should have the general intention of receiving the indulgence. Please note: the three conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father, along with detachment from all sin, only apply for plenary indulgences, but not for the partial indulgence.

St. Antoninus Fiscal Year 2020 Annual Report

Comments on FY 2020 Operating Results:

Financial Highlights

Our Stewardship Funding was down approximately 2.25% this year in comparison with the prior fiscal year. However, our balance sheet remains strong and we are committed to making sure we are good stewards of the Parish's finances. As always, we work diligently to control our operating costs and remain ever mindful of our awesome responsibility and privilege to dedicate your generous contributions towards meeting the current and future needs of all St. Antoninus Parish and School families.

A special thank you to our Parish Finance Council members and all our leadership teams for all the hard work they do throughout the year to help ensure we are mindful stewards of the Parish's finances and working hard to make important decision about our Parish/School needs.

Operating Highlights

In Fiscal Year 2020, we completed the replacement of both a collapsed sewer line and water line under the main parking lot next to the church. Additionally, due to the sewer and water lines being underneath the parking lot, we had to dig up a large portion of the lot and thus replace some of the parking lot. The funding for these projects were made possible through a very generous bequest left to the Parish. Also, with the use of these funds, we were able to upgrade the electric panel in the older building of the school. The electric panel was very "out of date" and needed to be upgraded to handle any additional or future electrical needs of the school.

In November of 2019, we hired TDG Facilities to manage our Parish/School facilities. Christopher Johnson, who has extensive facilities management experience, leads the TDG team here at St. Antoninus. TDG has been doing a wonderful job (especially during the Covid Crisis) and the school parents and parishioners have been extremely happy with work they have been doing.

Beyond brick and mortar projects, the Leadership Teams of the Parish are working to address pastoral concerns, adult and youth faith formation, youth ministry, and our music ministry (children's choir). Our school administration, through the timeless efforts of Principal Marianne Rosemond and faculty and staff, have worked through these very difficult "Covid" times. The school operates under a continuous improvement model where by it constantly challenges its mission and success under the forever evolving theories of education.


Looking Ahead

The Parish community (Church and School) is facing strong head winds in the form of (1) declining Mass attendance (24% decline between 2015-2019). (2) Sunday collection decline of 15% since 2015. (3) Student enrollment decline of 17% since 2015 and (4) school family stewardship envelope participation have reached the levels of where 28% give \$0.00 and 30% contribute less than \$500 per year. Very specific and directed efforts will be made in the immediate future to address the delivery of the Parish mission ministry and sense of community, while concurrently examining our parishioner's stewardship and commitment of time, talent, and treasures.




CHURCH REVENUE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020




CHURCH EXPENSES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020
