



# BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Dr. Kathy O'Connor PH.D 13<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24: The Wisdom books of the Old Testament were composed after the return from exile in the period between the fifth and first centuries BC. One of the main contributions made by the wisdom books to the body of Revelation is to show the very close connection between knowledge that comes through faith and knowledge obtained by human reasoning. The wise men of Israel ask questions to which they may not always find immediate answers but through their reflections God stimulates man in his search for truth which in the last analysis is a search for God Himself. Our passage from the Book of Wisdom explores wisdom and man's destiny. Wisdom is a divine attribute which God communicates to all mankind although earlier verses in this passage have an underlying conviction that wisdom is given in a special way to the people of Israel. Wisdom is identified with the Spirit of God: the creative and life-giving power of God. Man, like everything else was created to live: God did not make death. This is an optimistic view which goes right back to the first creation account in the book of Genesis. God is not the author of death; death is the result of sin. Physical death is not the sum total of death. The mistake of the ungodly is to think that nothing lies beyond death. This mistaken thinking is the result of the "wickedness" of their lives which prevents them from knowing God's purposes. God created man in the image of His own eternity (verse 23) and we must look beyond physical death to contemplate God's plan for us and our destiny.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 30: 2, 4, 5-6, 11, 12, 13 (2a): Psalm 30 is a psalm of David which was written for the dedication of the temple. It exhorts the faithful to praise God who saved the psalmist from death. It is reflective of a thanksgiving liturgy in the temple. Divine anger really consists of the Lord "hiding His face" which leaves man on his own. Man has a tendency to believe that we can fend for ourselves. The psalmist himself had such misguided thinking but realized the folly of this belief and reached out to God. Because of this experience, the psalmist understands that life only makes sense because he can praise the Lord, the source of all good.

Reading II: 2 Corinthians 8:7,9,13-15: St. Paul points out several charisms demonstrated by the Corinthians: faith, discourse, knowledge, earnestness, and love. As is evidenced by these charisms, the Church at Corinth has done many things well. Paul now appeals directly to the generosity of the Corinthians and reminds them of the example set by the Lord. The apostle does not give the Corinthians a command to provide financial support for others; he makes clear he is just giving advice on the matter. He is teaching them the way of Christian charity. Every Christian should have what he/she needs and should be helped by their Christian brothers and sisters when necessary. So, there is a time to give aid and support to others just as there is a time to let others help us when necessary. If we share in spiritual blessings we should share in material blessings as well. St. Paul taught: "your abundance at the present time should supply their needs, so that their abundance may also supply your needs that there may be equality".

<u>Gospel: Mark 5:21-43:</u> In our passage for Mass this weekend, Jesus saves two women from the power of death. Jairus' daughter is at the point of death. He actively seeks out Jesus and asks Him to lay His hands on the young girl so that she may be healed and live. Jairus obviously has faith that Jesus can do this. Jesus agrees and they set out to see the young girl. But the crowd is heavy and presses in on them. Jairus is not the only person seeking healing. In this crowd is a woman who has suffered from hemorrhages for twelve years.

Strictly speaking, she should not have been in the crowd because she was considered to be unclean due to the hemorrhages. If others touched her, they would become unclean. In the Bible, blood is the "seat of life" or blood is life. This woman's life had been draining away for twelve years. She had sought medical help and had been taken advantage of by many doctors. Yet she has heard about Jesus' curing the afflicted. She joins the crowd seeking His healing. She knows she is doing something forbidden: she should avoid crowds lest she make others unclean. She does not want to make Jesus unclean, so she tries to have as little contact with Him as possible: she touched His cloak. She had told herself "If I but touch His clothes, I shall be cured". She has come for physical healing, but she will receive so much more. She touched Jesus' cloak and immediately the hemorrhage stops. Jesus is aware that something has happened: He is aware that power had gone out of Him and He asked who had touched His clothes. The woman steps forward quite fearful, falls down, before Jesus and tells Him the truth. Her fear was not that Jesus would rebuke her; rather it was probably more a sense of awe at what had happened to her. Jesus addresses her as "daughter" which indicates a bond between them. He gives her spiritual healing as well as physical healing. Jesus and the crowd then move on toward Jairus' house and they are met with the news of the daughter's death. Jesus tells Jairus to have faith. Jesus accepts that the girl has died but Jesus can raise the dead as easily as we can awaken someone from a nap. Jesus invites the girl's parents and Peter, James, and John to enter the house with Him. Jesus told her to arise and arise she did! Jairus, Peter, James, and John were utterly astounded. He cautions them to tell no one and to give the little girl something to eat.

**Reflection:** Few passages show so clearly the character of Jesus' Lordship. He is powerful and wise with God's own power and wisdom (think back to the passage from Wisdom) and yet He puts Himself completely at the service of others (think back to the second reading). He calls on others to put their faith in Him, not for His own benefit, but for the sake of their salvation. Jesus said to Jairus: "Do not be afraid; only have faith". If we really learned this one lesson, it would revolutionize our lives. Do not be afraid of what other people think of you: follow the way of Christ. Do not be afraid of failure: following God's will is the only path to everlasting success. Do not be afraid of changing your personal plans to follow God more closely: His plans are far better. Fear, confusion, lack of trust in Christ: these are the kinds of things that tie our souls into knots, causing untold needless suffering and keeping us from experiencing the life-giving power of God's grace. It was faith that brought Jairus to his knees before Jesus and that same faith raised his daughter back to life. It was faith that propelled the woman to touch Jesus' cloak even though doing so was a risk and it was faith that cured her giving her peace after twelve years of uncertainty and fear. Faith and trust in God no matter what, despite appearances, despite the limited vision of our natural reason: this kind of childlike trust is what Jesus longs for from us. It allows Him to unfurl the power of His love in our lives. A personal note on "Do not be afraid". I was agnostic until I was 27 years old. I had suffered a devasting loss in May 1977 and had no faith to anchor me or sustain me. I happened to be watching television when newly elected Pope John Paul II stepped onto the balcony and said: "Be not afraid". That was in October 1978 and in April 1979 I was received into the Church. I am forever grateful. Perhaps this week we might ponder the following points: 1) is there anything that is spiritually draining me and separating me from others; 2) How can the woman in this passage serve as an example for me; 3) Am I in need of the courage to act on my faith; and 4) what is the greatest act of faith that has ever been asked of me? Lord, thank you for the gift of your Church and all the spiritual riches therein. You are always thinking of me, and always coming into my life in one way or another. Open my eyes to see more clearly your presence and action in my life. Please increase my faith, so that the power of your grace will touch me where I most need it....



It is extremely important that we hear and respond to the Blessed Mother's call. Sister Lucia the eldest of the three children of Fatima, received from the Blessed Mother, the devotion of the First Saturday of the month. Extra ordinary promises are given to those persons, whom on Five Consecutive Saturdays do the following.

- 1. Go to Confession in a reasonable amount of time before the First Saturday. (Our Church will have our Holy Hour on the  $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$  Thursday before the First Friday each month.) Confession will be available on all these Thursdays.
- 2. Receive Holy Communion in the state of Grace, and offer that Communion in reparation for the sins against the Most Immaculate Heart of Mary.
- 3. Recite 5 Decades of the Rosary.
- 4. Keep the Blessed Mother company for 15 minutes, while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to Her most

Immaculate Heart. This can be done anywhere.

The Blessed Mother in exchange for your commitment to the five First Saturdays told Sister Lucia that: "I will assist (be present) at the hour of your death (the person fulfilling the request) with all the graces necessary for salvation....) A powerful promise from our Mother.

Why five first Saturdays? According to Sister Lucia, they were requested to atone for the five ways in which people offend the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

- 1. Attacks upon Mary's Immaculate Conception.
- 2. Attacks against her Perpetual Virginity.
- 3. Attacks upon her Divine Maternity and the refusal to accept her as the Mother of all mankind.
- 4. For those who try to publicly implant in children's hearts indifference, contempt and even hatred of this Immaculate Mother.
