





BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Dr. Kathy O'Connor PH.D SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: 1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23: The books of 1 & 2 Samuel present the hereditary monarchy from David onwards as a system of government that God desired for His people. Samuel will become a judge of Israel and a prophet. Our passage for Mass this weekend presents an encounter between Saul who preceded David as king of Israel. Saul was bitterly jealous of David's increasing popularity among the people and makes attempts on his life. In this passage David has an opportunity to take revenge on Saul. The meeting between Saul and David is planned and it takes place in the open where Saul's troops are encamped. Saul's body guards are asleep leaving him unprotected and vulnerable. Instead of taking his revenge on Saul, David acts mercifully toward him and protects him (verse 9). Thus, we see an example of David's compassion and mercy (verse 23). In these traits, we have a glimpse of David as king. Mercy is a perfection proper to God and therefore a virtue to be expected of any representative of His and of everyone who wants to be like God.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 103:1-2, 3-4, 8, 10, 12-13, (8a): Psalm 103 is a psalm of David and is a call to bless the Lord who forgives His people and offers them protection from on high. In the previous psalm, a man on the verge of death pled for help and in our psalm for Mass this weekend, he thanks the Lord for restoring him to good health. The psalmist wants to praise God with his entire being for His steadfast love. The psalmist is pondering all that God has done for His people over the course of history and concludes by witnessing the immensity of God's love. In this psalm, David is praising God's mercy and in the first reading, we saw David acting with God's mercy toward a man who had tried to kill him.

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 15:45-49: In this passage, St. Paul is comparing and contrasting Adam and Jesus. Scriptural scholars and theologians, particularly the patristic theologians, often refer to Jesus as "the new Adam". Through Adam's original sin, we inherited the tendency to sin, and because of that we are destined to die. Jesus, the new Adam, when He comes again will give His followers a heavenly body, perfect and immortal. St. Paul refers to this as a spiritual body. Commenting on this passage from St. Paul, St. Augustine wrote "It is called a spiritual body not because it has become a spirit but because it is in such a way subject to the spirit, to fit it for it's heavenly abode, that every kind of earthly weakness and imperfection is changed into a heavenly permanence". Even in our present life, we should strive to reflect the image of "the man of heaven (Jesus)" by striving to be as Christ like as we can.

Gospel: Luke 6:27-38: Our Gospel passage is a continuation of Jesus' teaching to His disciples and the people nearby who also hear Him. This passage is sometimes referred to as the Gospel of Love. Jesus' teaching here goes far beyond the teaching of Moses: He is telling people to love their enemies. In the Mosaic Law, it is commanded to love your neighbor as you love yourself. The Israelites of Moses time generally believed they should love their fellow Israelites, but they could hate their enemies. They were hardly alone, and that belief persists today. But Jesus is raising the bar significantly: love your enemies. It is a radical demand on every disciple in every age and setting. It is insufficient to not hate an enemy, we must love them. So, we see this passage is all about how we treat other people: treat others as we, ourselves, want to be treated. We are to pray for our enemies and do good where they are concerned. If we lend money, we must not expect repayment. If we do not want to be judged, we must not judge others. If we want to be forgiven, we must forgive. Jesus taught by example: He forgave the people who crucified Him as He was dying on the cross. If we want to be shown mercy, we must be merciful. We saw an example of this in the first reading with David protecting Saul's life even though Saul had tried to kill David. Jesus is indeed raising the bar for interpersonal interactions. Loving others means doing good for others. This is what St. Paul meant in the letter to the Corinthians when he said we should strive to reflect the image of Jesus. St. Augustine said of this passage: "The measure of love is to love without measure".

Reflection: In this portrait of a true Christian, Jesus indirectly gives us a portrait of Himself. He shows us what kind of Lord He really is: nothing limits His generosity. Only because He is unlimited in generosity can he demand that His followers imitate Him. Jesus also teaches one of the mot basic laws of His kingdom: the amount we measure out is the amount we will be given back. The more generous we are with others, the better we learn the art of self-giving, of self-forgetful love, the more intensely we will experience the fulfilled and fulfilling life we long for. The reason for this is simple. We are created in the image and likeness of God and God is love; His very divine nature is all about self-giving. In this passage, Jesus gives us the very foundation of our fidelity, the sign by which we will know that we are living up to our vocation. The identifying mark of a Christian is treating others – all others, the way God treats us. God is kind even to the ungrateful and wicked. If we are His children, we will be kind and merciful too. We will be quick to forgive, quick to avoid judging and condemning. We will think well of others, speak well of them, and treat them like the children of God that they truly are. Perhaps this week we might reflect on the following: 1) who are my enemies and what is my attitude towards them; 2) when have I done something good for a person who hated me. When have I prayed for that person; 3) how well do I live up to Jesus' standards of love; 4) how has God had mercy on me? What am I doing to show mercy to others? Following Jesus' example, as we see in the Gospel passage, is not easy. It is challenging and difficult. Then again, Jesus never did say it would be easy; He only said it would be worth it. Lord, your standard of love often seems much too high for me. I sometimes don't feel up to that task. So, if you want me to live that way, you are going to have to come and be my light and my strength. Send your Holy Spirit into my soul and into the souls of all the members of your Church. Grant us a renewal of authentic Christian charity. Come Holy Spirit, enkindle in me the fire of your love.....


