

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Dr. Kathy O'Connor PH.D MARY, THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD

Reading I: Numbers 6:22-27: Our first reading for Mass this weekend comes from the Pentateuch; one of the first five books of the Bible. The book of Numbers has its own way of telling us about the experiences of the people of Israel as they make their way through the wilderness and describes how God acts toward the people He has chosen as His own. The passage for today occurs in the Sinai desert and God is depicted as the one who guides His people through the desert enroute to the promised land. The book of Numbers also gives us a glimpse the role priests play with the people: they are to bless the people. In our passage today, God tells Moses the blessing formula priests are to use. It is one of the earliest formulae for blessings and was used by priests in the temple liturgy. It has three petitions each of which begins with the name of the Lord. This blessing prays for protection (verse 24), grace (verse 25), and peace (verse 26).

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 67:2-3, 5,6,8, (2a): Psalm 67 is a prayer for divine blessings and that all the nations may praise God. The goal of the Psalmists' prayer is not so much for the good of Israel as it is for the recognition of God and His saving plans across the entire earth: that all mankind should join in the praise of God offered by Israel. In our own time, praise of God by all the nations comes about in the Church, thereby fulfilling the desires expressed by the psalmist. The Church uses this psalm on the solemnity of Mary the Mother of God to celebrate the fact that though her has come God's greatest blessing: Jesus Christ and having Mary as our mother to intercede with Him to continue blessing us.

Reading II: Galatians 4:4-7: This passage is taken from the part of the letter in which St. Paul gives a succinct summary of salvation history. St. Paul often speaks of Jesus' divinity but here he emphasizes the He was truly man. Jesus did not suddenly appear on earth in a kind of heavenly apparition: He really did become man, taking on human nature in the pure womb of a woman. Abba, in verse 6 is an Aramaic word which has come down to us with its translation "Father". This was not a word that Jews in Jesus' time would use to address God, most likely because it would have made God to familiar to them. The word Abba contains the kind of trust and tenderness that small children have in their dealings with their fathers. However, Jesus did not hesitate to use it and encouraged His followers to use it. In this way, Jesus does invite us to relate to God with the trust and tenderness of a child toward its father. Jesus invites us to be God's sons and daughters. St. Paul echoes this teaching and attributes to the Holy Spirit that movement in our hearts which impels us to cry out full of love and hope "Abba, Father!".

<u>Gospel: Luke 2:16-21:</u> St. Luke tells us the shepherds went in *haste* to Bethlehem (Bethlehem means house of bread). They didn't think about it or put it off. Obviously, a visit by a host of angels was truly extraordinary, so the shepherds immediately set off to see this infant about whom the angels had spoken. The shepherds found the infant just as the angels had said they would and they were *amazed*! The were so amazed that they shared the message from the angels to other people who, in turn were also amazed! And Mary kept all these things in her heart reflecting on them. Mary is a model of treasuring all that God says and does, meditating on His word and pondering His plan for her life. The shepherds were truly changed by their experience: they returned home glorifying and praising God.

<u>Reflection:</u> We use the word *amazing* for so many ordinary things in our lives. Continued on the next page...

But how amazing are those things in reality? Being visited by a host of angels and finding the newborn savior: that is truly amazing! The shepherds immediately responded to the angels' message and found the child just as they had been told they would. They shared that message with Mary and Joseph but Mary and Joseph were not the only people to whom the shepherds revealed the angels' message. They shared the experience of what they had seen and heard with many people. St. Luke does not tell us directly how the people in Bethlehem and its vicinity reacted to the news. Perhaps they too were amazed or astonished. But those reactions appear to be the extent of their response. Luke gives us no indication that those who were told about the birth of Jesus subsequently sought Him out. Their response was like someone being told, "God is offering you eternal life" and saying "Wow!" but doing nothing to take up God's offer. Perhaps this week we might reflect on the following: 1) how quickly have I responded to God's invitations and instructions, 2) how often to I meditate on Scripture, 3) how often do I meditate on what God is doing for me and through me, and 4) what is the specific lesson for me in the responses of the shepherds? Lord, more than half the people in this world still don't know you or believe in you. I am one of the privileged minority who has received the Good News. Teach me Lord, to be full of joy and generosity like the shepherds, full of wonder and contemplation like Mary, and full of the eager desire to spread the word.....






