Hello! My name is Father Henry, and I am the oldest of three boys. My younger brother is also a priest, in Hamilton Ohio, and my youngest brother is a Navy officer in flight school. As part of my history studies, I came to love the richness of Catholic history and tradition and became a Catholic in 2013. I entered seminary for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati a year and a half after that, and subsequently joined a religious order called the Oratory of St.

Philip Neri, which is in Cincinnati at Old St. Mary's Church in downtown Over-the-Rhine. I was ordained a priest on March 19, 2021, and after about eighteen months as a priest at Old St. Mary's, I discerned God's call to become a diocesan parish priest and I have since rejoined the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. I love the liturgy and the administration of the sacraments. My favorite thing to do as a priest is to hear confessions. It is a beautiful and moving experience of God's mercy.

I enjoy reading and studying, getting outside for exercise, good conversations with friends over bourbon and cigars, and deer hunting. I am excited to begin my ministry here at the Holy Eucharist family of parishes. I love to teach about prayer and the call to holiness in everyday life. Please pray for me and be sure of my prayers for you. I know the freedom and joy that comes from God's love, and hope to share that with you. We are all called to be saints, so let us daily conform ourselves to God's holiness and always become more converted to Him.

LENTEN REMINDERS - FAST AND ABSTINENCE Ash Wednesday, February 22 and Good Friday, April 7, are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast, that is, limited to a single full meal. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (canons 97, 1252). "Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection may be attained with uplifted and clear mind." (Constitution on the Liturgy, No. 110) With regard to the obligatory days listed above, however, there are frequent questions about the degree of seriousness of the matter. To paraphrase Pope John Paul II: the obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is also serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard; failure to observe an individual day of penance is not considered serious. People should seek to do more rather than less. Fast and abstinence on the days prescribed should be considered a minimum response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion.



BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Dr. Kathy O'Connor PH.D

6TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: Sirach 15:15-20: Sirach is the last of the canonical wisdom writings in the Old Testament. Although this book is never quoted formally, it seems to be echoed in many New Testament passages in words of our Lord reported in the Gospels, and in exhortations in the Letters of St. Paul, and St. James. Pope St. John Paul II, writing about the book of Sirach, said it is one of those works in which "Holy Scripture indicates with remarkably clear cues how deeply related are the knowledge conferred by faith and the knowledge conferred by reason". The reading for Mass this weekend is taken from the part of the book that presents how God grants wisdom to those who keep His commandments. In it we hear that God gave man both free will and the commandments. The Law does not coerce human freedom because it does not restrain man's ability to choose, but it does show us how to make the best use of free will. Although, on occasions temptation can make it difficult to make good decisions; we are always in a position to opt for good or evil. John Paul II wrote "Human freedom and God's law meet and are called to intersect, in the sense of man's free obedience to God and of God's completely gratuitous benevolence towards man".

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 119: 1-2, 4-5, 17-18, 33-34 (1b): Today's psalm in its entirety has 176 verses! The entire psalm has to do with the law of God: law, precepts, ways, decrees, commandments, statutes, ordinances, words, and promises. In the verses for Mass we hear that those who keep the law of the Lord are blessed (1-2), and that we should seek God's assistance in keeping the law (4-5, 17-18, and 33-34).

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 2: 6-10: Last weekend's passage from St. Paul acknowledged that the wisdom of the Gospel he proclaims certainly does not appear wise to those who are listening to him. In the passage for this weekend St. Paul strongly acknowledges that his proclamation contradicts the wisdom of his contemporary time and mentality. Here he teaches that the Gospel is not contrary to reason; however, the wisdom it contains is much more profound because it is divine wisdom. This wisdom is completely foreign to this world, this age, those who are responsible for the evil in the world. "Secret and hidden" in verse 7 is a reference to the content of divine wisdom and to its revelation; or, God's plan of salvation. Man can never completely grasp its meaning, just as we can never totally understand God. However, this secret and hidden wisdom can be known by means of revelation. God has this secret and hidden wisdom through the Holy Spirit, the third person of the Holy Trinity which is from God and knows the very depths of God.

Gospel: Matthew 5: 17-37: In this passage, Jesus stresses the never ending value of the Old Testament: it is the word of God. The law handed down to Moses and explained by the prophets was God's gift to His people. It was sort of an anticipation of the definitive law which the Messiah would lay down. Thus, Jesus says "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill". Christ is saying that if we want to enter the Kingdom of God, we must cooperate with God by being faithful to the law of God. In verses 21-26 Jesus gives us a very specific and concrete example of the way that He brought the Law of Moses to its fulfillment by explaining the deeper meaning of the commandments of that law. By speaking in the first person ("But I say to you") Jesus shows that His authority is above that of Moses and the prophets, or in other words, He has divine authority. In these verses Jesus identifies the sins mentioned in the commandments but takes it much further. We should remember that sin emerges from the heart:

Jesus focuses our attention first on *internal sins* – resentment, anger and hatred, and lust – to make us realize that this is where the *external sin* begins and that it is important to nip anger or lust in the bud. In verses 29-32 "right eye and right hand" refers to whatever we value most. Our Lord does not mean that we should mutilate ourselves physically, rather He is telling us to give up those things we value which lead to sin. King David in the Old Testament is a great example of this. David was very curious about Bathsheba. This was a case in which David should have most definitely minded his own business and redirected his curiosity. Unfortunately he did not. He indulged his curiosity about Bathsheba and committed adultery. Even worse, he had her husband Uriah killed so that he could then marry Bathsheba. He later wept over his sins and led a holy life in the presence of God. Many times in this column I have written that Christianity is not just a set of beliefs, it is a way of life. In the Gospel passage for this weekend, Jesus very clearly tells us how to live that life. Jesus sets high standards: forbidding anger and commanding us to seek reconciliation with those who have something against us. It is tempting to think Jesus' demands are unrealistic: only in heaven will there be no anger or divisions. But that is Jesus' point. To *enter heaven*, we must *live in a heavenly manner*; we must live under God's reign now if we expect to enter it in the future.

Reflection: Throughout the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus deals with everyday life. All of the examples He uses should cause us to rethink how we are living. Remember, Jesus goes beyond the laws of the Old Testament even while He says they need to be observed. In the first reading we saw how the passage from Sirach taught that human freedom and God's law were meant to intersect. Jesus tells us how to make that happen in the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus has come to fulfill the law, yet he expects His followers to go beyond the law. Anger, murder, lust, adultery, oaths, loving both friends and enemies are not easy issues to deal with yet we all must deal with such issues. Perhaps this week we might reflect on the following: 1) how seriously do I take God's laws, even the least demanding of them; 2) what is my reaction to Jesus' words about anger and abusive speech; 3) does anyone have a grievance against me; how could I pursue reconciliation; 4) what messages do Jesus' comparisons have for me? Lord, you care about what happens in my mind and in my heart — where only you and I can see. Help me look there now; show me what is pleasing to you and what is not, and then change what is not. Please Lord, you know I can't do it on my own. Show me the way. Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make my heart more like yours.....






SIENA CONCERT SERIES


