



St Antoninus Buildings and Grounds Committee Capital Improvements Update Spring 2023

The Saint Antoninus Buildings and Grounds Committee (B&G) is tasked with providing planning and consultation with the Pastor, Finance Commission, Director of Facilities and Administration for execution of grounds, infrastructure and facility projects to maintain our beautiful and functional campus. These dedicated volunteers have proven to be excellent stewards of your generous donations.

This update reviews major projects completed since the previous update last summer, and it includes projects in process or in the planning/budgeting stage.

<u>Cool the School</u> After your generous donations, air conditioning was installed summer 2022 in the occupied classrooms in our older buildings. Further donations will allow us to move forward with additional phases.

Roofing The campus' roofs are inspected regularly. The small, flat roof over the kitchen of the undercroft was replaced.

HVAC

<u>New Church Chiller</u> The old chiller that cools our church was 30 years old (normal life expectancy about 20 years), so it has been replaced. With supply chain issues, the new unit took about 15 months to be received and installed.

<u>Backup Pumps</u> Another supply chain issue has been procuring parts or whole pumps. We cannot cool or heat our large buildings without pumps. In the past, if a pump went down our HVAC vendor overnighted a new pump, so we were operational quickly. Now, pumps take months to receive. Since heating/cooling is crucial, we have been purchasing backup pumps to have on hand.

New Hot Water Expansion Tank This old unit was leaking and could not be repaired. A replacement has been ordered.

<u>Pavement</u> Having resurfaced the north lot (in front of school and along side the church) and the South lot (accessed by Linneman) in recent years, we now turn our focus to the east (lower) lot this summer. In addition to this year's resurfacing of that lot, within the next few years that lot will need substantial repaying for longevity.

<u>School Painting</u> Over the last 2 summers, the school office and main hallways have been transformed from a plain color to our school colors. This summer, we plan to add another hallway. Also, as in previous years, a group of dedicated volunteers painted four more classrooms last summer. We are looking to do the same this summer.

How much does this all cost? For regular cleaning and maintenance of our campus and buildings, the average year costs **over \$675,000**. This includes scheduled, managed capital improvement costs. Larger capital improvements such as Cool the School, a new Church Chiller and renew pavement of the east lot are above that cost.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Dr. Kathy O'Connor PH.D. THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

Reading I: Exodus 17: 3-7: The first reading for Mass this weekend finds the Israelites fleeing Egypt after their enslavement there. The severity of desert life (notably hunger and thirst) leads God to help the Israelites in various ways, all of which are full of theological implications. The Israelites, during their wandering in the desert, at times wondered if God existed at all. They questioned whether they had been brought out of Egypt to attain salvation or to die in the desert. The water which Moses causes to come out of the rock is a sign to bolster their faith. Moses strikes the rock as God has commanded him and water flows for the Israelites to drink. Theologically, Biblical scholars interpret this is a pre-figure of the sword piercing the side of Christ on the Cross from which flowed water.

<u>Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 95: 1-2, 6-7, 8-9 (8):</u> The responsorial psalm for this weekend is a call to praise the Lord. He is the King of the people He created and whom He nourishes and guides as a shepherd does his flock: just as He did as the Israelites wandered in the desert. Verses 8-9 is a warning to avoid any repetition of the rebellion in the wilderness that was featured in the reading from Exodus. Tempting God or putting Him to the test means testing His goodness and faithfulness by forcing Him to act.

Reading II: Romans 5:1-2, 5-8: This letter to the Romans was written near the end of Paul's life and is considered by Biblical scholars to be one of the "great letters" along with Galatians and 1 & 2 Corinthians. In this passage St. Paul is telling us that we are justified or placed in right relationship with God, not by our own doing, but by Jesus Christ. Faith leads us to know and be sure of the things we hope for; hope ensures that we shall attain them and enlivens our love of God. The love which St. Paul speaks of here is at one and the same time God's love for us and the love which God places in our souls to enable us to love Him. About this, St. Augustine wrote "To love God is entirely a gift of God. He, without being loved, loves us and enabled us to love Him. We were loved when we were still displeasing to Him, so that we might be given something whereby we might please Him". What He gave us was Christ's sacrifice to redeem us. While we were still weak, St. Paul says, Jesus died at the right time to save the ungodly.

Gospel: John 4: 5-42: Our Gospel passage for Mass this weekend is the story of the Samaritan woman and the well. Jesus asks for a drink, thus continuing the theme of water from the first reading. He was tired and thirsty after His travels. In both the first reading and the Gospel, water is a biblical symbol of life. Jesus' interaction with a Samaritan woman breaches the social and religious customs of the time. Jews and Samaritans generally

went to great effort to avoid each other. The woman indicates her amazement that a Jewish man would ask a Samaritan woman for a drink of water! This incident is important. Like us, Jesus did get tired and thirsty. He needed to rest. But, in this incident, although tired and thirsty He does not waste an opportunity to do good to souls. Think about this act for a moment. Here is God asking a mere creature to do *Him* a favor! This is not just a story about a woman giving a thirsty man a drink; it is the story of the Samaritan woman's conversion. When the woman asks Jesus how a Jewish man would ask a Samaritan woman for a drink of water, she is responding to the action of grace in her soul: her readiness to talk to Christ, who was a Jew, is the first stage in her change of heart. Later in the passage she will take a real interest in what Jesus is saying, opening herself up further to God's influence. We see her religious feelings starting to emerge when she mentions "our father Jacob". Then Jesus begins to teach her about eternal life and she responds to him. Jesus then does what seems at first a strange thing: He tells her to call her husband. She honestly admits that she has no husband. Jesus then astounds her by telling her that she has had five husbands and the man with whom she is living is not her husband! Upon hearing what Jesus said to her she identifies Him as a prophet! With this statement, her conversion has begun.

The Samaritan woman is now fully aware that she is speaking with someone of authority and asks Jesus about the proper place in which to worship God. The Jewish people held that only Jerusalem would do whereas the Samaritan's claimed that the shrine erected on Mount Gerizim was also legitimate basing their claim on some passages in the first five books of the Bible (called the Pentateuch). Jesus not only answers the question but takes advantage of it to confirm the value of the teachings of the prophets and thereby reaffirm revealed truth: the Samaritans are in the dark about many of God's plans because they do not accept all of the Old Testament. The Jewish people on the other hand, are much nearer the truth because they accept the whole of the Old Testament. But both Samaritans and the Jewish people need to open themselves to the new revelation of Jesus Christ. When Jesus finishes teaching about the prophets the woman tells Jesus that she knows the Messiah is coming. Jesus tells her that He is the Messiah using the words "I ...am he" which recall the words Yahweh used to reveal Himself to Moses! The Samaritan woman's conversion is now complete. In the final verses of this passage (v 39-42) we find that the woman left her water jar at the well and went off into the city and told the towns people about Jesus. Many Samaritans from that city believed in Jesus because of the woman's testimony. They went to see Jesus for themselves and asked Him to remain with them which He did for two days. The passage ends with these people believing in Jesus, no longer because of the woman's testimony but because of Jesus Himself.

Reflection: With His words "I am he", Jesus tells the Samaritan woman that He is the one whom Jews await as the Messiah; the one whom Samaritans await as the bearer of God's final revelation. The Samaritan woman is in the presence not simply of a prophet (v. 19) but of the Prophet spoken of by Moses. Earlier Jesus indicated that the women did not realize with whom she was speaking (v. 10) and now He announces that the one who is speaking with you is the long-expected Messiah and revealer. What a stunning announcement! Indeed, this passage is a perfect example of the mission of the Lord. Here was a woman in search of answers and direction, although she may have given up on finding them. Jesus sees all the need she has and His heart overflows with love. He sees a soul in need and He reaches out. The interaction between Jesus and the Samaritan woman show an entire evangelization process at work. The Samaritan woman has converted and is enthusiastic about Jesus. She goes in search of others to share with them the news of Christ and they become interested in Jesus because of her testimony. This process is at work in our present time. People who are not Christian learn of Jesus through their Christian friends or family members. People who do not believe in Jesus learn about Him through us. Perhaps this week we might reflect on the following: 1) how did Jesus seek me out and draw me to Himself, 2) how might I have reacted if I were that woman; how do I respond when Jesus speaks to me? Lord, please let me be like the Samaritan woman at the well. Let me invite people to come hear you. Let people become interested in you because of my witness.....
