## BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Dr. Kathy O'Connor PH.D. EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

Reading I: Acts of the Apostles 10: 34a, 37-43: Our first reading begins with Peter addressing a group of gentiles. Because he is speaking to gentiles he does not make reference to Scripture as he would with a Jewish group. He tells his audience a summary of Jesus' public life, His crucifixion, and His resurrection. Peter tells his audience that Jesus has commissioned the apostles to preach the good news to the people and to tell them Jesus has been made judge over all mankind and will deliver His judgment at His second coming. Christ's coming as Judge at the Parousia (second coming) means that men will appear before Him twice to render an account of their lives: their thoughts, words, deeds, and omissions. The first judgment will take place when each of us departs this life. The second occurs when on the same day and in the same place all shall stand in the general judgment at the second coming.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 118: 1-2, 16-17, 22-23 (24): The psalm for this Easter Sunday is a psalm of Thanksgiving. It is the last of a group of psalms (113-118) called the Hallel, a Jewish prayer or verbatim recitation from psalms 113-118 which is used for praise and thanksgiving that is recited by observant Jews on Jewish holidays. This last psalm echoes with the voice of a triumphant king. The king's victory manifests the steadfast love of the Lord and his name is exalted above the nations. In our psalm for this weekend we see what comes from trusting the Lord and how the promises to thank and praise the Lord are kept. In this acclamation the people acknowledge that God has established a new order through the victory won by the king. The Church uses this psalm in the liturgy of Easter Sunday thereby acknowledging that a new order of salvation has been established by the resurrection of Christ.

### There are two possible passages for the second reading for Easter Sunday

Reading II: Colossians 3: 1-4: In this passage, St. Paul is clarifying the reality of Christ for the community at Colossae. He is reminding people that with Baptism we die to sin and rise to life in Christ. Therefore, we should divest ourselves of worldly, temporary pleasures and seek what is above. In Baptism we share Christ's passage through death to a new kind of life and it is this life we should pursue.

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 5:6b-8: Jesus used the example of leaven in dough to describe the growth of goodness and also of evil. In both cases a small amount can produce a very large result. Here St. Paul uses the simile to show the Corinthians the harm a negative, sinful behavior can do to the whole community through the bad example. It is possible to get rid of the old leaven of malice and evil because of the paschal sacrifice of Jesus Christ. Those old ways of behavior can be replaced by Christian values and ways of acting. Jesus is the true Lamb who takes away the sins of the world. By dying Jesus destroyed our death and by rising He restored our life.

Gospel: John 20:1-9: The Gospel passage tells of the joyous discovery of Jesus' glorious resurrection. Mary Magdalene went early to the tomb "while it was still dark" and discovers that the stone has been removed from the tomb. She fears that Jesus' body has been taken so she runs back to where Peter and the apostles were to tell them that the Lord has been taken from the tomb. The apostles run to the tomb to investigate for



themselves and they find only the burial clothes. The beloved apostle (John) reached the tomb first but did not go in. Peter arrives next and enters the tomb and discovers that the cloth covering Jesus' head was not with the other burial cloths but was rolled up in a separate place. Some Scripture commentators make interesting observations on the wording of the passages about the burial cloths. Peter entered the tomb and saw the burial cloths "there". *Continued on the next page...*

The use of the word "there" seems to indicate to some scholars that the clothes were flattened or deflated, as if they were emptied when the body of Jesus rose and disappeared – as if the body had come out of the clothes and bandages without their being unrolled; passing right through them. This would explain the clothes simply lying after Jesus' body, which had filled them, left them. Mary Magdalene thought that Jesus' body had been stolen by grave robbers but the two apostles realized that there was no question of any robbery because they saw the special way the clothes and head cloth were. They now began to somewhat understand what Jesus had told them about His death and resurrection.

Reflection: What must it have been like to have been Peter, Mary Magdalene, and the beloved disciple that morning? Peter had been devastated by his denial of the Lord during the Passion yet it was to him that Jesus left the keys of the Kingdom. Mary Magdalene and John, the beloved apostle had stood at the foot of the Cross grieving and consoling our Blessed Mother. Now, they behold the empty tomb. What does it mean? The empty tomb and the other facts were perceptible to the senses, but the resurrection even though it had effects that could be tested by experience, requires faith if it is to be accepted. Christ's resurrection is a real, historic fact: His body and soul were reunited. Jesus' resurrection was a glorious resurrection and far beyond our capacity in this life to understand what happened. While it is historical it is also supernatural. However, the apostles begin to think back to Jesus' predictions about His passion, death, and resurrection. They also reflected on Old Testament prophesies about the glorious victory of the Messiah and in some way, His resurrection. John, the beloved apostle saw the cloths and believed. And so they began to grasp the true meaning of Scripture after the resurrection and will to even a greater degree after Pentecost. Perhaps we might reflect on the following: 1) what do I think was the nature of the disciple's belief; 2) when have I experienced a surge of belief, a joyful confidence I could not put into words; 3) how has the Holy Spirit and John's Gospel helped me to more fully understand Scripture passages that apply to Jesus? Lord, I believe that you have risen from the dead although I still tend to live as if this life were all there is. But, in my heart you know that in my heart I am seeking your will and your kingdom. Help me to seek them as I ought. I want to live my life for your sake: building up your kingdom, obeying your will, making you known and loved by everyone around me. With the love of your heart, inflame my heart, Lord.....




