"Where Does It Say That?" -Allows Abortions Through 9 Months of Pregnancy

Amendment Language:

"But in no case may such an abortion be prohibited if in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician it is necessary to protect the pregnant patient's life or health."

Danger of Language: In U.S. law, "health" includes age or physical, emotional, or psychological well-being. This means a woman's age or emotional health could be cited to justify aborting a full-term baby.
