

To get started in your preparation process, please call the Worship office at least six months before your wedding date. ANOINTING OF THE SICK: If you are anticipating surgery or have become ill and would like to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, please contact Christy Welsh in the Worship office.

LITURGY & WORSHIP: PREPARING FOR MASS

Many people complain that they don't get anything out of Mass. Unfortunately, this is sometimes a valid complaint, since we get out of Mass what we put into it. As we celebrate the Paschal Mystery of the suffering, death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus, we should rededicate ourselves to enter prayerfully into the Mass, because the Mass makes these eternal mysteries present to us in our time and place. It does not repeat the death and Resurrection of Jesus, nor does it merely recall it; rather, in the Mass, Heaven and Earth are joined together, and eternity enters time, so that one and the same event is made actually present in many places and at various times throughout the world. This gives each of us personal and physical access to the reality of Jesus' death and Resurrection. Jesus tells us that if we are to be His disciples, we must take up our own cross and carry it after Him. At the Mass, we participate in His sacrifice, which empowers us to live out our own. And so what we ought to be "getting out" of Mass is the strength to live in such a way that we always lay down our lives every day - that a daily death of self unites us to the death of Christ, so that a daily resurrection can lead us to an ultimate resurrection to the Timeless Day of Eternity. The power to deny our selfishness and embrace the joy of true love is what we ought to get out of Mass. And we get that by totally giving ourselves, at Mass, and in every action.

Therefore, the proper way to participate at Mass is to offer oneself to God to be transformed. We offer our mind by giving careful attention, our bodies by humble acts of worship such as kneeling, our hearts by loving prayer. This means we participate with faith, hope, and charity. We will get something out of Mass to the degree that we participate in this way, and then live out the Mass in our daily actions of self-sacrifice for love of others.




