**MATRIMONY:** We ask that either the bride or groom be a registered, active parishioner for at least six months before arranging a date for your wedding. To get started in your preparation process, please call the Worship office at least six months before your wedding date. **ANOINTING OF THE SICK:** If you are anticipating surgery or have become ill and would like to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, please contact Christy Welsh in the Worship office.

## Family of the Most Holy Eucharist Summer Mass Schedule

June 2, 2025 – August 14, 2025

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This summer is going to be an interesting one for me as I will be away from the Family of Parishes from June 16 – August 11, 2025. First, from June 16<sup>th</sup> - 30<sup>th</sup> I will be on vacation. Six of those days I will be attending a Conference for Confessors, in which I will study and compare the old Rite of Confession with the new, discuss how to help penitents overcome modern sins, and learn how to use healing prayer in my ministry. From July 1<sup>st</sup> – August 2, I will begin my sabbatical. Sabbaticals are a three-month respite/break from parish life to be used for spiritual, educational, and/or physical renewal. Priests can apply for a Sabbatical every ten years of priestly service. Two options for sabbaticals are available, three consecutive months in one calendar year or one month in each of three consecutive years, I have chosen the latter. This year, I will be participating in a 30-day silent Ignatian retreat in Boston with the Oblates of Mary Immaculata. Finally, on my way back from sabbatical, I will stop in Wheeling, West Virginia from August 4-7<sup>th</sup> to join all the active priests in the Archdiocese for the Priest Convocation. I will return to normal duties the following Tuesday, August 12, 2025.

During my vacation, conferences, and sabbatical, Fr. Louis Jacqueman will be named administrator to handle the day-to-day functions of the parish. However, covering the current weekday Mass schedule is difficult. Therefore, the weekday morning Mass schedule is being amended from June 2-August 14 to just one Mass each day, Monday through Friday. Please see the chart below. Please note that all daily Masses will be at 8:00 am followed by Confessions. The Saturday and Sunday Mass schedules along with evening confessions will remain unchanged.

**ST. CATHERINE OF SIENA:  
FEAST DAY APRIL 29**

St. Catherine, patron saint of nurses and people ridiculed for piety, was a third-order Dominican, peacemaker and counselor to Pope Urban VI. Born in 1347, Catherine was the 23rd of Jacopo and Lapa Benincasa's 25 children. Her twin sister died in infancy. As a child, Catherine was an exceptionally independent child who held a dedicated prayer life. At seven years old,

Catherine had the first of her mystical visions, in which she saw Jesus surrounded by saints and seated in glory. In the same year she vowed to consecrate her virginity to Christ.

As a young adult, Catherine joined the Dominican Tertiaries. She lived a deep and solitary life of prayer and meditation for the next three years in which she had constant mystical experiences, capped, by the end of the three years with an extraordinary union with God granted to only a few mystics, known as "mystical marriage." Throughout this time, St. Catherine suffered many intense periods of desolation alongside her mystical ecstasies, often feeling totally abandoned by God. She ended her solitude and began tending to the sick, poor, and marginalized, especially lepers.

Catherine was called to a public life in her twenties, advising many influential figures, including the Pope. She played a key role in achieving peace between the Holy See and Florence, convincing the Pope to return from Avignon in 1376, and healing the schism between followers of Pope Urban VI and his opponents in 1380, even while on her deathbed. She is named the co-patron of Italy and Europe.

Her mystical visions are recorded in her Dialogues, written about the human soul and our Heavenly Father's response to our needs. She received the stigmata in 1375, invisible to the human eye until after her death. She died in Rome on April 29, 1380, at the age of 33.

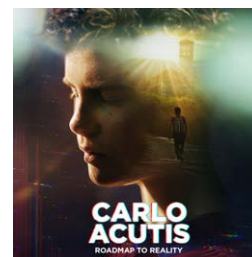
