

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

STAY CLOSE TO GOD AND HE WILL STAY CLOSE TO US.

As our Lenten journey begins, we are thrown out into the desert of our lives to reflect upon how the evil one continues to harass and tempt us to turn from God. Jesus is lead out into the desert by the Holy Spirit, where He fasts and prays for forty days and nights, and the devil, the tempter, comes to Him and challenges Jesus. Because Jesus had prepared Himself by praying and fasting, He was ready for the challenge. We, too, need to pray and fast in order to face the tempter and his challenges in our days. Jesus reminds us to stay close to God and He will stay close to us and take care of us. By God's graces we can move away from sin and evil in our lives, we are stirred by the Spirit to confess our sins and be made clean once again, building up the relationship God so desires to have with each of us. The sin of Adam and Eve in the garden of Eden has been overcome by the passion and death of Jesus and through His action, we have all been saved. Let us worship and serve God alone and keep the evil one at bay!


- Confirmation will be March 23, 2023.

Please contact the parish office at least nine months prior to the intended date of marriage. No wedding date can be set until the initial interview and pre-marriage inventory are completed.


SACRAMENTS FOR THE ILL, HOSPITALIZED OR HOMEBOUND

Saint of the Week

St. Casimir I March 4



We live in a culture that tells children, "Follow your dreams! Be who you want to be!" It might be hard to imagine the courage it took to be St. Casimir. A prince second in line for the throne of Poland, the young man had great expectations placed upon him. Inspired by a devout tutor, St. Casimir developed a deep faith. As a teenager, he would often sleep on the ground, reject courtly finery for plain clothes, and dedicate long hours to prayer. He even made a private commitment to celibacy. Casimir's avoidance of a military engagement made his father furious. The king imprisoned his own son. The episode confirmed to St. Casimir that he served a higher King, Jesus Christ. He would spend the rest of his life in prayer, study, and service to the poor. When we need courage to do what is right, St. Casimir, pray for us!






