Government urges against tax increase for Social Security

MASHINGTON (4) — The Ford administration yesterday recommended against any new Social Security tax increases before 1977 but refused to submit specific new proposals to halt deficits expected in total \$14.6 billion over the next three years.

Casper W. Weinberger, secretary of health, education and welfare, told the House Ways and Means subcommittee on Social Security that the refusal was prompted by the "cavalier disregard" shown by Congress toward the administration's earlier proposal to reduce benefit increases if July for 35 million poor and elderly Americans.

The testimony was called "shocking" by the subcomchairman, Rep. James A. Burke, D-Mass., who aid delaying higher taxes until after the next presidential ection would be politically popular but fiscally irrespon-

Rep. Joseph E. Karth, D-Minn., told Weinberger:

Weinberger said the proposal to limit Social Security and Supplemental Security Income cost-of-living increases this year would have trimmed \$2 billion from the 1976 budget deficit. An 8% increase was proposed ast viekk.

We are reluctant to put forward another specific repesal in light of the cavalier disregard our most recent uggstion received," Weinberger said.

t may be said that limiting benefit increases is morpular," Weinberger testified. "I can only say that that is even more unpopular is jeopardizing the fiscal meefity of the Social Security system."

ctuaries predict that the Social Security system will have deficits of \$3 billion this calendar year. \$5.8 billion in standard \$5.3 billion in 1977. By the early 1980s, the emergency trust fund reserves will be exhausted unless someming is done, the actuaries said.

He said Congress should act soon to provide new s of revenue but should not put increases in either the payroll tax rate or the wage base upon which Social Security taxes are levied into effect before 1977 to avoid slowing the nation's economic recovery.

urke said in an interview after the hearing that the government could lose as much as \$2 billion in interest if the Social Security trust funds are drawn down.

Longress cannot wait until 1977 to halt the deficit dram he said. It may have to boost the current \$14,100 axalle wage base to a minimum of \$18,000 in 1976 despite Gereneral elections that fall.
