44th KJT General Convention

You can see her letter to the membership on page 3 of this issue of the KJT News. As a result, we will be seeking candidates to fill her position. In order to run for this position, you must attend at least 50% of your local society's meetings during 2025, so if you are interested, please be sure to fulfill this requirement. The full eligibility requirements can be found on this page.

Delegate/Director/ Resolution Requirements

If you are interested in being a delegate to the convention, would like to run for a place on the board of directors, or would like to submit a resolution for a by-law change.

- 1. DELEGATE ELIGIBILITY
- a. To be a delegate at the 44th Convention in 2026, the By-laws state that a delegate must be a Catholic insured member (life or annuity) and must attend at least 50% of the local society meetings of whom they represent from January 1, 2025, through December 31, 2025.
- b. A member may not be a delegate if they or their spouse is a state officer, director/directress or insurance representative representing another fraternal life insurance organization.

2. RESOLUTIONS FOR BY-LAW CHANGES

- a. Resolutions for changes to the Charter, Constitution, and By-laws must be submitted to the State Secretary on or before February 21, 2026, in order to be presented at the convention.
- b. No motions and proposed revisions shall be allowed from the floor at the General Convention.

3. DIRECTOR ELECTIONS AT THE CONVENTION

- a. To run for director:
- i. Must be eligible to serve as a delegate (attend 50% of meetings in 2025)
- ii. Must submit an application of candidacy (request from home office)
 - iii. Must consent to a background check (get from office)
 - iv. Must submit resume along with items ii and iii.
- b. Items ii, iii, and iv above must be submitted to the KJT State Secretary between February 1 and April 1, 2026.
- c. Applications will be reviewed by a qualifications committee and the applicant will be notified if the application is approved or disapproved.
- d. A document that contains the roles, duties, and qualities of a director can be requested from the Home Office
- e. If a candidate wants to run against an incumbent director, the same procedures as above are applicable.

Beno A. Hellinger Obituary



Beloved father and grandfather Beno A. Hellinger passed peacefully to his eternal reward while at home with his loving family on February 16, 2025.

He was born November 16, 1935, one of eleven children to Beno and Bessie Hellinger in Kovar, Texas. He spent his youth working on the family farm, then graduated from Smithville High School. In his senior year of high school, he was elected "Class Favorite," which is no wonder since, though he might have seemed reserved, he made lasting connections with everyone he met.

He served in the U.S. Army from 1957 to 1960, most notably in Alaska working in the Army post office. Later, he used his mechanical skills at his brother Fred's gas station and then worked as a butcher at a meat packing plant in Austin. Dad worked for thirty years for the U.S.

Postal Service in Austin. As a long time member at St. Louis Parish, he was a dedicated volunteer in several ministries such as usher, money counter, and Fun Fest cake walk. He enjoyed working with the Knights of Columbus, spending many Sunday mornings making breakfast tacos and Lenten Fridays preparing the fish for Lenten fish fries with his perfected method. An active member of the Smithville KJT Society #63 and RVOS, Dad served in offices for his local chapters of both organizations.

Family was so important to Beno, and that started with his meeting Jane Goertz on a blind date. Married in 1964, they settled in Austin at a house that grew along with the family. It was a special treat from Dad when he suggested the family get to eat outside on the picnic table. He orchestrated day trips to places like Enchanted Rock, San Antonio, and Marble Falls with kids piled in a station wagon or in the back of a covered truck.

Through the years, he loved working on the farm with cows and growing vegetables. Mom would say he was like a little boy once he got onto a tractor. Because he kept the farm going, when it reached being 100 years in the family, the State of Texas

awarded the Hellinger Farm as a Designated Family Land Heritage Property.

He could build just about anything out of wood from small bookshelves to farm buildings, he grilled the best chicken around in his homemade bbq grill, and his special recipe smoked sausage made any meal a celebration. He started the family's annual Fourth of July Ice Cream Crank Off which combines his love of ice cream and friendly competition with his sense of patriotism. Passing on a love for his Czech herit-

age to his children and grandchildren, Dad filled every Sunday with polka music. His unique sense of humor and generous hospitality made every gathering delightful for everyone.

Beno is survived by his ten children: Diane (Titus) Ashour, Catherine (Kevin) McCue, Pamela (Keith) Tabor, Paul Hellinger, Laura (John) Duckworth, Charles (Dolly) Hellinger, John (Angie) Hellinger, Linda (Hoyt) Moss, Mark (Vaness) Hellinger, and Elaine (Ryan) McGuckin. He is also survived by 23 grand-

children and five great-grandchildren plus his sisters Helen Alloway and Henrietta Meuth. He is preceded in death by his loving wife of 59 years, Jane Goertz Hellinger.




SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

Mary's Faith

"Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the LORD would be fulfilled." (Lk 1:45)

On May 31, we celebrate the liturgical Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This feast commemorates not just a simple family event between two cousins. The Visitation is an event of salvation history and teaches us much about the dynamics of faith. Like us, Mary had to walk by faith. One writer likens faith to darkness and light. It is dark because we cannot fully grasp divine truth. It is light since faith brings us to truths we cannot know otherwise. Mary walked in the light of faith. God told her enough about His plan for her to make each new step. Faith is not only intellectual, that is, belief. Faith is also trust and action. Pope St. John Paul II in Redemptoris Mater, #14, offers an inspiring account of Mary's faith:

"To believe means to abandon oneself to the truth of the word of the living God, knowing and humbly recognizing 'how unsearchable

are his judgments and how inscrutable his ways' (Rm 11:33). Mary, who by the eternal will of the Most High stands, one may say, at the very center of those inscrutable judgments of God, conforms herself to them in the dim light of faith, accepting fully and with a ready heart everything that is decreed in the divine plan."

Faith means to say "amen" ("so be it") to the word, the command, and the promises of God. An important element of Mary's faith is also

common to ours. God speaks to us through others. We come to know God and His saving plan through people in the Christian community; for example, parents, teachers, preachers, and others. Revelation is not made directly to us. Except for the special experience of the Annunciation, Mary came to know God's will through others.

Mary's faith, which is praised by Elizabeth, draws her to the dignity of being the Mother of Jesus and still greater to being a true disciple of the Lord. Faith was not easier for her than for us. The contrary is true. For Mary it was more difficult to believe than for the apostles. She understood more of God's plan. Pope St. John Paul II commented that the expression, "blessed is she who believed," is a key unlocking the innermost reality of Mary. Being aware that this faith was difficult, involving deep struggle, gives us an insight into Mary's life and evidence of her likeness to us, sharing completely in the human condition, but without sin.



Annie Straka Hyzak of Austin Society #112 Honored by KJT at **Texans of Czech Ancestry Banquet**

Annie Straka Hyzak truly exemplifies the Czech culture, history, and spirit of what it means to be Czech. She reads, speaks, writes, and translates the Czech language—a skill that not many Texan Czechs can do today. At the last KJT state convention, she was professionally recorded speaking her native Czech. Besides being actively involved in the KJT and the KJZT, she is also a member of the Austin Czech Historical Association (ACHA), Travis-Williamson Counties Czech Heritage Society (TWCCHS), and the Texas Czech Genealogical Society (TCGS). Anne is an officer in almost all of these organizations and is known for giving numerous presentations about Czech culture. Program topics include

early Texas Czech schools. Czech wedding, Easter, and Christmas customs, Czech immigrants, and other items of interest. She has researched old Czech newspaper articles to aid her presentations, and as a retired high school math teacher, she is capable of holding everyone's attention. Anne has written two family history books about her maternal grandparents and stories about her aunts and uncles, most of whom lived in the Corn Hill, Texas area. At the request of Father Nesrsta of Holy Trinity Catholic Church, Anne reads the biblical passages at their annual feast day Czech Mass for Sts. Cyril and Methodius, having done so since 2013. Anne participates in the annual multicultural recitation of the Rosary at St. Louis King

of France Catholic Church in Austin by leading a Czech decade. She was a member of the Happy Czech Singers for many years, a group based at St. Louis that traveled to festivals, funerals, and other events

As a talented seamstress, Anne sewed authentic Czech costumes (kroje) for her daughter and herself to wear to Czech Night at the annual Austin Aqua Festival in the 1970s and 1980s. When she became a grandmother, she did the same for her two granddaughters when they were Little Sisters to the TWCCHS Queens. Through the years, Anne made colorful posters for Czech Night at Aqua Fest and bake sales for member organizations. Other creative contributions include floral

arrangements and decorations for different Czech functions. She has traveled to the Czech Republic four times, visiting distant relatives in Moravia which requires conversing in Czech with them, while serving as translator for others traveling with her.

To provide a lasting legacy, Anne contributes memorabilia to Czech museums in the Central Texas area. Additionally, Anne is involved in other civic and church activ-

ities, such as Austin Retired Teachers Association (ARTA) and North Austin Civic Association (NACA). Anne has been recognized by TCGS for her contributions to Czech culture and by TWCCHS as a 2013 TOCA recipient. She has also received CHS's top state award for her active involvement in Czech activities. Anne is very deserving of this TOCA Award for her continued support of all things Czech.


