A friend in Northern California, contemplating removing an evergreen sapling in his yard one day, said, "It's strange how that has been a sapling all ten years I have owned this home." Contemplating a tree, contemplating the age of a 60-year old human, or contemplating a retreat apostolate that has thrived for over 60 years can be mind-boggling. A retreat is a place where you can pray, think, take stock in the parts of our lives that are eternal, reflect on the needs of our souls, the place, time and people that God has placed you in and with.


#### Sponsors Club Makes a Difference
