



DECEASED PRIESTS—DIOCESE OF ORLANDO

The Office of Senior Priests sends a monthly list of deceased diocesan priests and their anniversary dates with the request that it be included in the parish bulletin for the parishioners to remember the priests in prayer.

For the month of August, the deceased priests are:

August 8, 2008 - Reverend Sean Shine

August 26, 1993 – Reverend Bronis Benesevich

August 28, 2013 – Reverend Michael Hannon

Reverend Sean Shine

Father Shine was born May 5, 1926 in Cloghast, County Limerick, Ireland. He attended Kimmage Manor Seminary and was ordained as a Holy Ghost Father June 29, 1952 in Dublin. From 1953 to 1968, he was assigned to missions in the Archdiocese of Dwitcha, Nigeria. When the Nigerian government expelled foreign missionaries, Father Shine made his way to Florida. He was incardinated into the Diocese of Orlando in 1978. He served at Our Saviour Parish in Cocoa Beach, All Souls Parish in Sanford, St. Brendan Parish in Ormond Beach, and Epiphany in Port Orange. In 1981, he was appointed pastor at St. Thomas Aquinas Parish in Bartow. From 1983 until his retirement in 2000 Father Shine served as pastor of Immaculate Heart of Mary in Ocala. Father Shine died August 8, 2008.

Reverend Michael J. Hannon

Father Hannon was born December 7, 1918 in County Clare, Ireland. He attended St. Patrick College Seminary and was ordained June 6, 1947 as a Pallotine Father. He worked in missions in Argentina for 6 years and became fluent in Spanish and Portuguese. He then worked in the Archdiocese of Westminster in England before arriving in the Diocese of Miami in 1961. He was incardinated into the Diocese of Miami in 1966. He served in several parishes including Sacred Heart in Okeechobee from 1966-1969. In 1968 Okechobee was incorporated into the newly created Diocese of Orlando and Father Hannon became incardinated into the new diocese. He then served as pastor of St. Mary of the Lakes in Eustis from 1969 – 1986 when he retired. Father Hannon died August 28, 2013.



LIGHT AND DARKNESS

Genesis 1:4 says that God separated the light from the darkness"; St. Augustine suggests that it refers to the separation of the good angels from the evil angels. But even if that's not what the original author intended, he says, describing the one group as "light" and the other as "darkness" is still accurate.

"God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble" (James 4:6). One group lives in the Heaven of heavens; the other is thrown out of there, and rages through the lower regions of the air. One is tranquil in the brightness of piety, the other tempesttossed with desires that cloud the way. One at God's pleasure, tenderly helps and justly avenges; the other, attacked by its own pride boils with the lust of conquering and hurting. One is the minister of God's goodness; the other is kept back by God's power from doing the harm it wants to do. The first laughs at the second when it does good unwillingly by its persecutions; the second envies the first when it gathers in its pilgrims.

These two angelic communities, then, are different from and contrary to one another, the one both by nature good and by will upright, the other good by nature but by will deprayed. We see them in other and more explicit passages of holy writ, but I think they are spoken in this book of Genesis under the names of light and darkness.

And even if the author might have had a different meaning, yet our discussion has not been wasted time; for, though we have not been able to discover his meaning, yet we have stuck to the rule of faith, which the faithful gather well enough from other passages of equal authority. For, though it is material-works of God that are spoken of here, they have certainly a resemblance to the spiritual, so that St. Paul can say, "For you are all sons of light and sons of the day; we are not of the night or of darkness"

> (1 Thess. 5:5). -St. Augustine, City of God, 11.33 IN GOD'S PRESENCE, CONSIDER . . .

In St. Augustine's description, which most resembles my own inner life of the fallen angels, or the life of holy angels?

CLOSING PRAYER:

Holy angels, humble angels, may I desire what you desire - to serve - that I may be found in the city of God at the fulfillment of history.

THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD AUGUST 6, 2021



In Year B, the reading for the Transfiguration comes from Mark's gospel. (The Transfiguration also appears in the other two synoptic gospels, Matthew and Luke.) In Mark, Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up a high mountain, apart from the other apostles and disciples.

There, Jesus is transfigured (changed in form and appearance) and appears in dazzling white clothes. Elijah, the great prophet, and Moses, through whom the Israelites were given the law, appear with Jesus. A cloud appears, overshadowing them, and a voice states, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Jesus charges the three to not share with anyone what they had seen "except when the Son of Man had risen from the dead." They keep their experience to themselves, pondering what Jesus meant by rising from the dead.

How are we to understand the Transfiguration? The story of the Transfiguration is also proclaimed on the second Sunday of Lent—a key part of Jesus' journey towards the Cross. The Catechism of the Catholic Church draws parallels between Jesus' Baptism and the Transfiguration. Jesus is baptized at the start of his public ministry. His baptism proclaims the mystery of our first regeneration—we die and rise again with Christ. The "Transfiguration 'is the sacrament of the second regeneration': our own Resurrection (St. Thomas Aquinas, STh III, 45, 4, ad 2). From now on we share in the Lord's Resurrection through the Spirit who acts in the sacraments of the Body of Christ.


The Transfiguration gives us a foretaste of Christ's glorious coming, when he 'will change our lowly body to be like his glorious body (Phil 3:21)'" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 556). During the Prayer after Communion, we pray that God might "transform us into the likeness of your [his] Son, / whose radiant splendor you willed to make manifest / in his glorious Transfiguration." The Collect, or opening prayer, tells us that the mystery of the Transfiguration "prefigures our full adoption to sonship." The Transfiguration, initially revealed to Peter, James, and John, reveals to all of us a taste of what is yet to come.

The Transfiguration is the fourth of the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary.


The virtue for the month of August is "Joseph, Mirror of Patience". Patience is willingness to suffer. A patient is one who suffers a malady not by choice whereas a patient man is one who suffers volitionally rather than relinquish the vocation given him. Joseph was patient because of his love. He was willing to suffer anything, even the loss of Our Lady and the Divine Child by being the first to die.

WEEKLY MEDITATION FOR THE WEEK OF AUGUST 1ST

Not only did Saint Joseph listen attentively to God, but he also listened attentively to other people. His willingness to listen to Mary his wife bore great fruit in his life. Even though he did not always fully understand what she said, her perspective helped deepen his understanding of God's plan over time. Listening to her helped him continually make Jesus a priority in his life.

Spend 10 minutes each day this week giving someone your undivided attention. Simply listen, trying to understand their perspective.




