Prayer: Merciful Lord, we beseech thee to cast Thy bright beams of light upon Thy Church, that it being enlightened by the doctrine of Thy blessed Apostle and Evangelist Saint John may so walk in the light of Thy truth, that it may at length attain to the light of everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

The son of a Jewish fisherman, John was born early in the first century in Galilee. He and his brother, James, were followers of John the Baptist, who one day presented Jesus to them, saying, "Behold, the Lamb of God." (John 1:36). By evening John and James knew they had found the Messiah.

The brothers followed Jesus for three years, witnessing His miracles and struggling to understand His message. Their devotion to Christ was extremely passionate. Once, when a village of Samaritans (a group despised by the Jews) refused to offer Jesus shelter, John and James offered to call down fire from heaven to destroy them. But Jesus reproached them. Christ's teachings were grounded in love, not vengeance a lesson John came to embrace.

Known as the "beloved disciple," John was part of Christ's inner circle. John sat beside Him at the Last Supper, prayed with Him while He suffered in the garden of Gethsemane and was the only disciple to stand with Him at His Crucifixion. Just before He died, it was John whom Jesus asked to take care of His mother, Mary.

A Message of Love : John lived for another 70 years, assisting Peter in spreading Christ's word. He outlived his fellow disciples and was the only one not to be martyred, although it is said as a prisoner in Rome, he once miraculously escaped unharmed from a cauldron of boiling oil. Despite the danger, John continued to teach Christ's message of love. When he was an old man, John finally wrote about his memories of Christ's life. Today, we refer to those writings as the fourth Gospel.

The eldest son of an immigrant Irish family in Connecticut, young Michael left school at 13 to work in a brass factory making spoons. At 16 he began studies for the priesthood in Quebec, but was obliged to leave to help support the family when his father died. Michael completed his education in Baltimore, Maryland, and was ordained

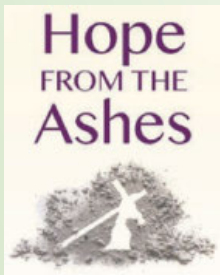
for the diocese of Hartford in 1877. Assigned to St. Mary's Parish in New Haven, Fr. McGivney was very active in parish and civic affairs, serving as director of public plays and fairs. He volunteered to become the guardian of Alfred Downes, a minor whose father had died leaving a large family in poverty. This situation as well as his own family's circumstances and that of other immigrants impressed on Fr. McGivney the need for lay Catholic men to establish a mutual aid society to provide financial assistance for their families if the primary wage earner died. Protestant fraternal groups already provided this type of life insurance protection for their members. In 1882, Fr. McGivney formed the Knights of Columbus among a small group of St. Mary's parishioners to promote charity, unity, and fraternity, assisting widows and orphans. Because of the Knights' emphasis on serving Church, community and family, the organization grew and did not remain strictly parish-based. Patriotism was added as a founding principle in 1900. Father McGivney died from pneumonia in 1890 and was buried in Thomaston, Connecticut. Later his body was moved back to St. Mary's in New Haven where it remains today. He was beatified in 2020.

Hope from the Ashes: Embarking on an Evangelizing Lenten Journey



As our churches are facing growing disaffiliation and many people are increasingly struggling in the wake of a global pandemic, the future can appear uncertain. Yet, it is within the season of Lent – interestingly enough – where we can find great hope in guiding people back to our faith. We especially notice this on Ash Wednesday every year when

Christian worship spaces around the world are packed with women and men who are giving faith a second chance. Together, we will explore this incredible phenomenon and how each of us can respond by embarking on a joyful Lenten journey of intentional sharing of faith and pastoral accompaniment.

Paul E. Jarzembowski is the author of *Hope from the Ashes: Insights and Resources for Welcoming Lenten Visitors* (Paulist Press, 2022) and serves as the Associate Director for the Laity at the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) in Washington, DC. Originally from the Chicagoland area, he is an internationally-recognized speaker, teacher, writer, and consultant on pastoral ministry and evangelization, especially with young adults. Paul also serves on the boards of directors/advisors for several national Catholic organizations and the Vatican.



Sarah K. W. Jarzembowski is the Director of Evangelization for St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Catholic Church in Crofton, Maryland, and a national consultant on ministry with young adults for Lifelong Faith, an ecumenical training center. For over two decades, she has worked in pastoral ministry for dioceses, college campuses, parishes, and religious communities that are based in Washington DC, Baltimore, and greater Chicagoland areas.

FEAST DAY - FEBRUARY 8TH (ST. JOSEPHINE BAKHITA)



Saint Josephine Bakhita was born in Sudan in 1869 and enslaved as a child. Eventually she was sold to an Italian diplomat and taken to Italy, where she was later brought to freedom through the help of the Canossian Daughters of Charity. Through their guidance, she learned about God and served him faithfully until her death in 1947.

In October 2000, Josephine Bakhita was canonized by St. John Paul II, at which point he noted that “in St. Josephine Bakhita we find a shining advocate of genuine emancipation. The history of her life inspires not passive acceptance but the firm resolve to work effectively to free girls and women from oppression and violence, and to return them to their dignity in the full exercise of their rights” (St. Bakhita’s Canonization Mass, October 1, 2000). In the movie *St. Bakhita*, St. Josephine Bakhita is bought by an Italian white merchant named Federico Marin after years of being beaten and abused as an enslaved child. The cinematic depiction of the saint’s life shows that once in the Marin household, the daughter of the master, Aurora, takes a strong liking to Bakhita and chooses her as her nanny. Bakhita is treated like an outsider and accused of being wicked by other servants because of her black skin. Despite this, Bakhita proves to be generous to everyone she encounters even if they have wronged her.

Today, the feast day for St. Josephine Bakhita— February 8—is recognized as the annual day of prayer and awareness against human trafficking. Through prayer, we not only reflect on the experiences of those that have suffered through this affront to human dignity but also comfort, strengthen, and help empower survivors.

As Bishop Eusebio Elizondo, former Chairman of the Committee on Migration, has stated: “On that day, we will lift our voices loudly in prayer, hope, and love for trafficking victims and survivors. If just one person realizes from this day that they or someone they know is being trafficked, we will have made a difference.”

ST. JAMES THE GREAT

Prayer: O gracious God, we remember before you today your servant and apostle James, first among the Twelve to suffer martyrdom for the Name of Jesus Christ, and we pray that you will pour out upon the leaders of your Church that spirit of self-denying service by which alone they may have true authority among your people; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen

While walking by the lake of Gensareth in Galilee, Jesus saw James and his brother John in a boat with their father, Zebedee, a prosperous fisherman. Jesus called to the brothers, and they immediately abandoned their nets and father to join him. Both men instantly dedicated their lives to Christ and became his disciples.

Tradition says that after Jesus’ Resurrection, James the Greater (so called because a younger James later joined the Apostles) traveled to Spain to spread Christ’s teachings. He returned to Jerusalem just as Herod Agrippa began to persecute the Christians about the middle of the first century. Herod ordered James’s arrest and then sentenced him to death by the sword. But even in the face of death, James never lost his faith or courage.

Indeed, the man who arrested James was so impressed by James’s commitment to Jesus that he became a Christian and begged for God’s forgiveness. Like James, he was also killed for turning to Christ.

The Early Missionary : James’s violent execution made him the first Apostle to suffer martyrdom. After his death, his followers supposedly placed his body in a boat and cast it to sea. Centuries later, during the Middle Ages, a vision lead a hermit names Pelayo to James’s burial site, located at a place along Spain’s Atlantic coast called Compostela. Soon after, “Santiago de Compostela!” (the word iago is Spanish for James) became a war cry for Christians battling the Moors. Thousands flocked to the site, attracting as many pilgrims as Rome and Jerusalem did during the same period.

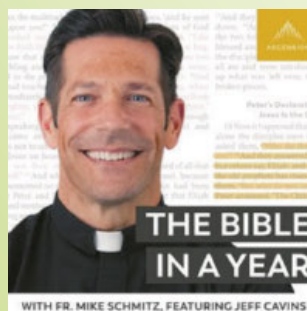
