Andrew lived during the first century. A fisherman by trade, he was a disciple of John the Baptist until the day Jesus was baptized. After Andrew learned from John that Jesus was the true Messiah, Andrew followed Jesus home and stayed there for hours. Amazed by all he saw and heard, he urged his brother Simon (Whom Jesus called Peter) to meet Jesus. Soon, they were both believers.

Andrew and his brother maintained their fishing business until the day Jesus said, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." (Mark 1:17) At once, they abandoned their home and family to travel with Jesus, marveling at His wisdom and lessons. They also managed the ever-present multitude of people who pursued Jesus, expecting to witness a miracle.

One day, 5,000 people followed Jesus to a mountaintop. As dinnertime neared, Jesus asked his disciples to feed the crowd. Andrew said, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" (John 6:9) Jesus had the crowd sit and began to distribute the loaves and fish, which miraculously multiplied. When everyone finished, the disciples needed twelve (12) baskets to hold the leftovers.

Spreading the Word of Jesus: After Jesus' Resurrection, Andrew became a missionary, establishing Christianity in Asia Minor and Greece. Jesus had warned the Apostles that preaching His gospel would create enemies. Andrew was eventually martyred in Greece tied to an X-shaped cross so he would suffer longer.



SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Today we hear Luke's version of the Beatitudes, the core of Jesus's message of liberation. Because Matthew's audience was predominantly Jewish, he places this scene on a mountaintop in order to parallel Jesus with Moses on top of Mt. Sinai receiving the Law. Luke, with his predominantly Gentile audience

places Jesus on a plain in order to accommodate the crowd not only of Jews from Galilee but from Judaea and Jerusalem but even Gentiles from Tyre and Sidon. The great catch of people has already begun!

Luke's Beatitudes—and Woes—play with the paradox that the way the world sees and judges people is not the way that God does. As Jeremiah says, it is those who trust and hope in the Lord who, in the long run, are truly blessed—just like Jesus.

- Do you judge success by the short term or the long term?
- What image do you too frequently try to project?
- When did you first realize that Christ's message is about liberating love and grace?
- How can you bring that message to your community?
 Your family? Your neighborhood? Your church?

Practice: Look around you, at your family, your friends, your coworkers, your neighbors. How can you bring someone blessedness and not woe this week? What word of liberation and grace, gratitude and support can you speak this week?

FEAST DAY - FEBRUARY 14TH (ST. VALENTINE)




How February 14 came to be celebrated as the feast for lovers is somewhat a mystery. What little is known of the feast's namesake can be attributed to the lives of two martyrs: one a priest, the other a bishop. Their lives bear little resemblance to the contemporary holiday. The

priest Valentine reportedly was beheaded in 269 by Emperor Claudius II. The bishop, known for healing, was martyred earlier. PROCLAMATION OF THE JOURNEY OF THE PEOPLE OF THE DIOCESE OF ORLANDO FROM THE MOST REVEREND JOHN NOONAN, BISHOP OF ORLANDO



The entire People of God share a common dignity and vocation through Baptism. All of us are called in virtue of our Baptism to be active participants in the life of the Church. In parishes, small Christian communities, lay movements, religious communities, and other forms of communion, women and men, young people and the elderly, we are all invited to listen to one another in order to hear the promptings of the Holy Spirit, who comes to guide our human efforts, breathing life and vitality into the Church and leading us into deeper communion for our mission in the world. As the Church embarks on this synodal journey, we must strive to ground ourselves in experiences of authentic listening and discernment on the path of becoming the Church that God calls us to be (Vademecum 1.2).

Acknowledging our own weaknesses, and having experienced a world pandemic, we pray fervently to embark on this journey of Synodality with all God's People and affirm our desire to know God and to be nourished by Him through the Eucharist. In our spiritual reality, food plays a primary role in the story of salvation, from the forbidden fruit in the garden which brings forth sin and death to the food of Christ's body on the tree of the Cross which brings forth everlasting life. Pope Benedict XVI wrote, "The remembrance of His perfect gift consists not in the mere repetition of the Last Supper, but in the Eucharist itself, that is, in the radical newness of Christian worship. In this way, Jesus left us the task of entering into His "hour." "The Eucharist draws us into Jesus' act of self-oblation. More than just statically receiving the incarnate Logos, we enter into the very dynamic of His self-giving."

From our entry in His self-giving, we call upon the Holy Spirit to sanctify our daily living and make us holy that we are able to be Christ as we receive Him. For by its very nature, the Eucharist demands to be shared with all. Prompted by the Holy Spirit, we call out to each other with Love of God and through, with and in God, listen with eyes of mercy and ears of hope in the Lord that His Word might be known throughout the earth. We offer our heart to each other as we are leaven in the world in which we live and work. We pray that those whom we encounter, individually and collectively, will come to know our joy that they are with us

The Church exists to evangelize. We can never be centered on ourselves. Our mission is to witness to the Love of God in the midst of the whole human family. Through Pentecost 2022, we offer our whole self - body, mind, soul and strength - to serve the dialogue of God with humanity and to journey together as servants to the coming of the kingdom of heaven

We turn to our Patronness, Mary, the Mother of God, who by her fiat shares in the redemption brought forth by her Son given to us as the Bread of Life through the Eucharist. We beseech her to guide us on this journey that we may become the true face of her Son for all the people.

Now, therefore, I, Bishop John Noonan, the fifth Bishop of the Diocese of Orlando, do hereby proclaim through Pentecost 2022 as a time of purposeful journey of Synodality. I call upon the holy people of God of the Diocese of Orlando to observe this time with renewed fervor that this journey of faith will arise from a gaze of Love. In our prayer, we invoke the Holy Spirit and humbly listen to Him, journeying together as He, the source of communion and mission, desires – with docility and courage.

Come, Holy Spirit! Come, Spirit of love, open our hearts to hear Your voice! Come, Holy Spirit of holiness, renew the holy and faithful People of God! Come, Creator Spirit, renew the face of the earth! Amen




