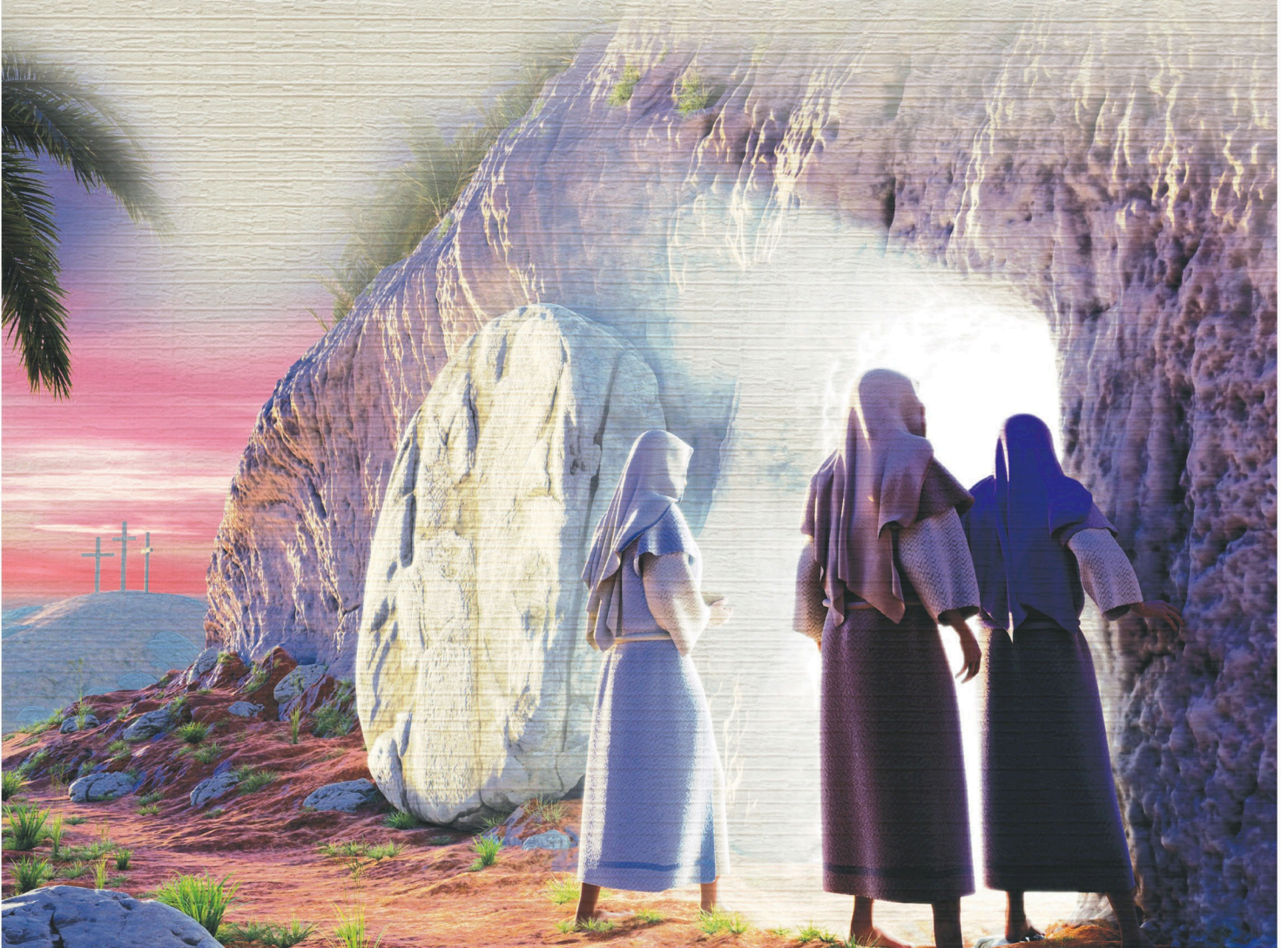

NOTES FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

A Joyous Easter to everyone! This is our most solemn feast because we celebrate the miracle of Christ's Resurrection from the dead. Many have recommended the new film *Risen*—which deals with a Roman tribune searching for the body of Jesus after reports of the resurrection. Contrary to what many directors previously depicted as leaving the absence of Jesus' body to your imagination, the film *Risen* is robustly Christian and substantially faithful to the Biblical account of what transpired after the death of Jesus.

Risen's far more reasonable and theologically compelling answer is that, yes indeed, if an outsider and unbeliever burst into the Upper Room when the disciples were experiencing the resurrected Jesus, he would have seen something along with them. The Resurrection of Jesus was much more than a psychological desire of those who loved Him. The realities of life and laws of nature may rob us of what is essential to our creed where we believe "on the third He rose from the dead." The condemned, brutally slain Jesus entered the grave and was risen from the ranks of death; for with God nothing is impossible.

This Resurrection is the foretaste of those who now sleep in the Lord. It brakes the chains of the world as we know it and tells us that ultimately grace triumphs over sin, life is victorious over death. In Jesus we find salvation. In His Resurrection we enter True Life.

May you share the endless Joy of what we celebrate today. A Blessed Easter to everyone. You are remembered in our Masses on this greatest of feasts.

LITURGICAL INSIGHTS

The *Exsultet*: the Proclamation of Easter

At the Easter Vigil, one of the Church's most beautiful hymns is chanted in joyful proclamation of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ and is the exultant and jubilant response of the Church to the Light of the Risen Christ entering the sanctuary.

This Light of the Risen Christ is represented by the Paschal Candle, lit by the fire that is blessed before the presiding priest blesses the candle and has it carried into the darkened church. Once the Paschal Candle, the great Easter symbol of the Church representing Christ's defeat of death by His own Death-and Resurrection, is set in its stand, the deacon, whose primary responsibility it is, incenses the candle and then proclaims in chant the glory of the Resurrection as symbolized by this vibrant light.

This wondrous and captivating hymn fills the heart with the greatest of joys that Christ makes true on His promise to rise after three days in the tomb and therefore the heart is assured of hope that Jesus Christ, the Son of God, will raise from the dead those who have been faithful to Him to spend eternity with Him.

Named after the first word of the hymn in Latin, "Exult," the *Exsultet* praises God in thanksgiving for the gift of the Light of the Risen Christ and the reality of the Resurrection by commanding the hosts of Heaven to exult, then all the earth, and then the Church both Universal and particular (that is, the parish church).

Below are some of the verses from the glorious hymn, the *Exsultet*.

"Be glad, let earth be glad, as glory floods her, / ablaze with light from her eternal King, / let all corners of the earth be glad, / knowing an end to gloom and darkness...

"Invoke with me, I ask you, / the mercy of God Almighty, / the He, Who has been pleased to number me, / though unworthy, among the Levites, / may pour into me His Light unshadowed, / that I may sing this candle's perfect praises...

"O truly necessary sin of Adam, / destroyed completely by the Death of Christ! / O happy fault / that earned so great, so glorious a Redeemer!...

"Now we know the praises of this pillar, / which glowing fire ignites for God's honor, / a fire into many flames divided, / yet never dimmed by sharing of its light...

"May this flame be found still burning / by the Morning Star: / the one Morning Star Who never sets, / Christ Your Son..."

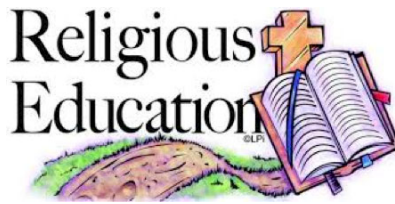

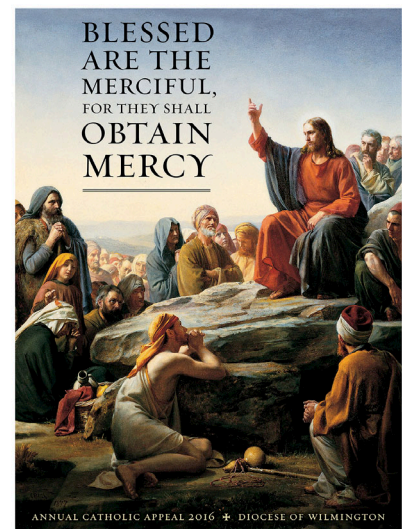
2016 Annual Catholic Appeal – “*Blessed are the Merciful for They Shall Obtain Mercy*”

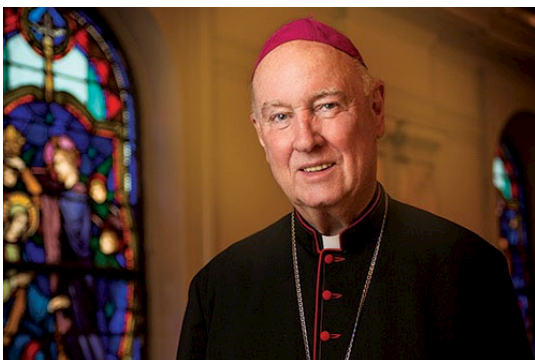

“Hawaiian Paradise” is the theme of St. E’s Twelfth Annual Fundraising Auction

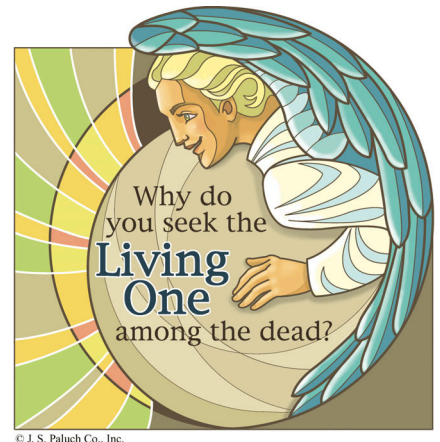

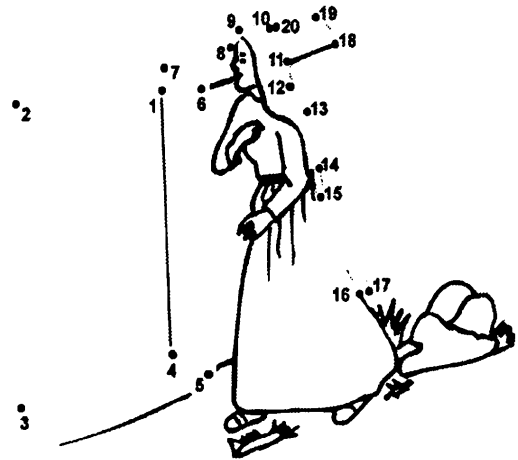

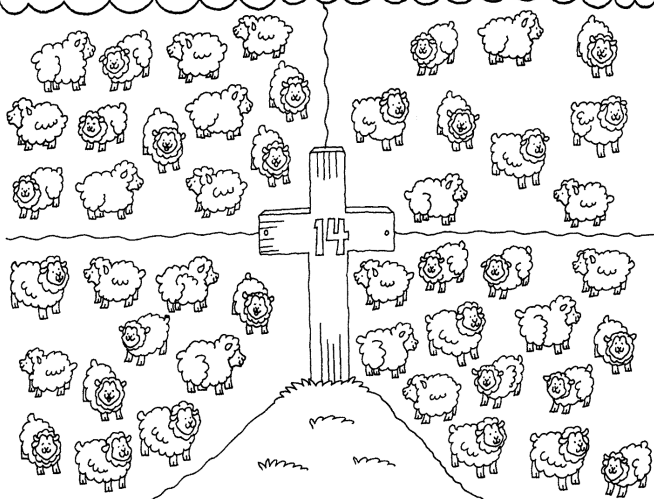
