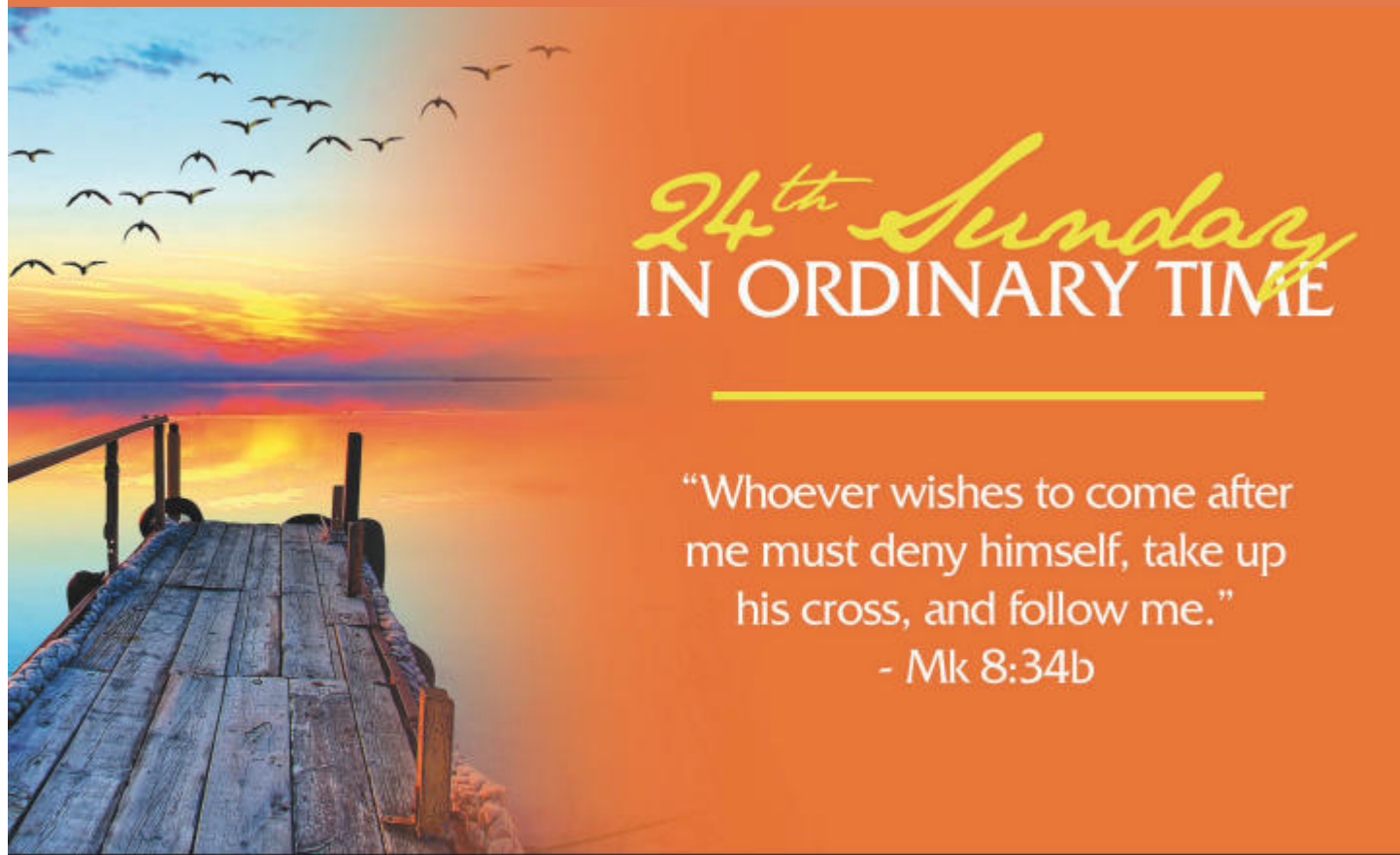

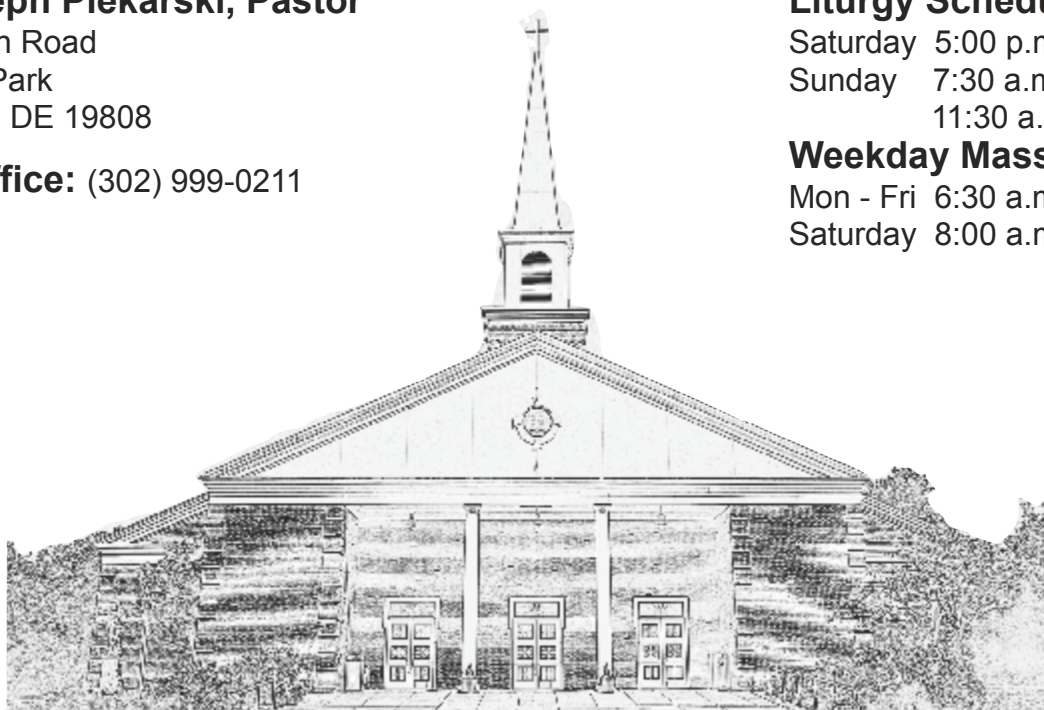

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

We just celebrated this week, the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross and then the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows. These feasts commemorate the finding of the true cross, in Jerusalem, by Saint Helena; followed by the sorrowful presence of Mary at the foot of the cross. Both days point to the suffering of redemption. It was on the wood of the cross, a tree commonly used daily in the Roman regions, where criminals were executed publicly. Precisely there, Jesus took upon Himself our sins and suffered brutally for our salvation. Standing with Him was His Mother. She suffered the agony of witnessing her Son's humiliating, cruel death. Her tears were not only of a mother but that of the first disciple of Jesus.

The prophet Isaiah, in today's first reading, was ready to embrace whatever humiliation and pain that following God might entail. He is willing to offer his back to those who beat him and his cheeks to those who pluck his beard. This passage is called the "Suffering Servant" of the one who is convinced that God will help him in spite of his troubles.

Every one of us has troubles. Those who are followers of Christ will, indeed, know the cost of following Him. We just celebrated the seventeenth anniversary of September 11th and recall the multitude of good people who were consumed by that terrorism. These past months disclosed even more horrific accounts of children, young people and their loved ones who suffer from abuse by clergy. The increasing loss of too many from the epidemic of addictions and suicide is a chronic social suffering. The lack of necessities to simply live plagues thousand throughout the world and in our neighborhoods and make innocent people suffer.

The sufferings and answers are complicated and all of us empathize with Saint Peter today when, after Jesus foretold His passion and death, Peter says: "God forbid, Lord that anything should happen to you." Jesus' rebuke must have stung Peter terribly. "You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." Peter thought that happiness could come without a price. He was not ready to put up a fight against evil nor suffer for something that was infinitely greater than this life.

As followers of Christ, we have to be willing to sacrifice the happiness of this world for the sake of the Kingdom of God. "Whoever wishes to save his life will lose it. But whoever will lose his life for my sake and for the sake of the Gospel will save it."

We celebrate **Catechetical Sunday** this weekend to honor everyone who follows in the footsteps of Jesus by passing on, in word and example, the lessons from Jesus. Appreciation is extended to our School Principal, Director of Religious Education, RCIA team, all teachers in various programs and all those who volunteer to pass on to the new generation, the deposit of faith.

You may noticed that the side door at the rear of the church is periodically out of service and blocked off with yellow caution tape. Blame the weather. However, when we have torrential rains (1” to 3” per hour) with flash flood warnings, the water overwhelms the drainage system and comes in under that door. It is sealed in advance to prevent water damage to the carpet and the tape is removed when the threat passes.

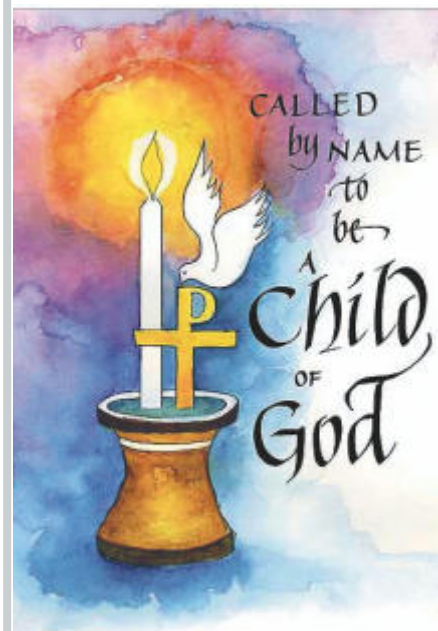
Priest: Let us pray for priestly and religious vocations.
