


# A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This time of the year has shorter days that will be remedied somewhat next Sunday when we return to Standard Time. The lengthy darkness is suitable for what we celebrate this week with things that go bump in the night. Have you noticed that we make light of those things that we are unfamiliar with or in the dark about? We often talk to ourselves when walking in total darkness in fear of falling, tripping. We jokingly decorate with funereal themes and ghostly images to amuse ourselves of that which is a reality of life and yet, the most unknown. These dark places blind us and therefore...frighten us.

Halloween is the eve of all that is holy...All Saints Day. It is o.k. to be a little scared of the unfamiliar but All Saints Day is really about those holy people who live in complete Light, without even a shadow. Not only those canonized by the Church but all faithful men, women and children (hopefully many we have known) who went beyond the darkness of death and now shine in the Resurrection of the Lord forever.

The following day, All Souls Day, is a prayerful day that lifts our beloved dead from the certainty of death to the hope of resurrection. Only Christ can bring anyone of us through that dark passage; so we prayerfully depend on the mercy of God to deliver our beloved dead to His perpetual light. Our prayers help them beyond the grave.

Our first reading, this Sunday, reminds us that this is the will of the Lord, to lead us back to Himself in mercy, both, the blind and the lame. The Gospel mirrors all of us who live in the dark. Like the blind beggar we say: "I want to see!" We want to be delivered from our fright of uncertainty: the obscurity of a meaningful life, the dimness of the reality around us, the gloom of the wickedness that we cannot control, the blackness of death. As proclaimed in today's Gospel, with Jesus we have nothing whatever to fear. He is the Light we are all waiting for.


