


# A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I think that of all the things the Lord asks us to do in our following Him, nothing is more difficult than what is in today's Gospel: "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, pray for those who mistreat you, turn your cheek, and give to anyone who asks of you." Hatred is not easy to overlook, especially when you have been injured, and yet that is what Jesus is calling us to do.

Hatred is not only destroying the world but our communities, families and even individual people...who hate themselves. To end this malignancy, to fight off hatred...we begin with the anger that is within us. It is good to know why you feel the way you do about someone. Truly admit what is the problem. Perhaps it was an injustice that someone did to me that altered my life drastically or it may be the remembrances of how someone tormented or created misery for me. It is sometimes worse when we hate the person who wronged a loved one of mine. And this nemesis is the person we are called to forgive.

Is the Lord asking too much? Of course not...He is God. I guess the problem is within us and it is not avoidable. It is not normal for a human not to object when being hurt. Even animals will retaliate. It is the "better angels of our nature (A. Lincoln)" that call us to let go of the bitterness and move on in life; otherwise you will carry an unnecessary burden and never advance. That being said ... how do you forgive? You can't. But God can and that is why Jesus said "pray for those who maltreat you."

To admit that you were legitimately wronged is healthy and to bring it to prayer is the solution. By naming the person who causes you pain and praying for their conversion as well as your own healing of heart is the formula. It is difficult at first but God sees the broken heart and somehow heals that which you cannot even describe. In time, you start to pity that person and may even see a conversion of heart going on in him/her. This is what Jesus asks from us....be as "compassionate as Our Father in heaven is compassionate". By entering this Godly realm, healing takes place...and the heart and the world can be a better place.

Another shout of "*Thank You*" to everyone who thus far contributed to the "Raise the Roof Campaign." Thus far, what is collected has replenished what was taken from our savings to make the necessary repairs for the roof and ceiling. Thank You. More work on the hall/gym will take place in the near future. Your support and donations are appreciated.



## **NEW Adult Bible Study Programs:**

Beginning March 5, we will have a 7-week program titled: "The Mass." If the Mass is not the highlight or the high point of your week, you NEED to attend this program. It will show us how every word, every comma, and every action has particular intentions to bring us into unity with God and His Church.

This program was developed and is presented by Bishop Robert Barron. Bishop Barron's presentations are similar to those in His famous Catholicism series. He is a great Catechist. The 6 presentations, each about 25 minutes, are titled: 1. A Privileged Encounter 2. Called out of the World 3. God Speaks Our Story 4. Responding to God 5. Preparing for Sacrifice 6. The Real Presence Creates Communion.

The program will be offered on Tuesday evenings from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. The sessions will include prayer, a DVD presentation, and discussion. Each session will be in the St. John Bosco conference room (the old chapel).

Starting March 7, we will have a 6-week program titled: "No Greater Love: A Biblical Walk Through Christ's Passion." This program was developed by Dr. Edward Sri. The course will be offered on Thursday mornings from 9:30 to 11:00 a.m. and/or Thursday evenings from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. The same material will be presented both times. Each session will include prayer, a DVD presentation, and discussion in the St. John Bosco conference room (the old chapel). The DVDs were recorded in the Holy Land.

We will study the Scriptures and view the places where they occurred as we walk from Gethsemane to the Mount of Calvary. With the biblical events, we will explore what Jesus was experiencing and go deeper into the meaning of each of the events and better understand the words of the Passion. Throughout, we will encounter God's love to the fullest as He anticipates His suffering and gives His life for us. We can use this Lent as an opportunity to sacrifice our time and our effort to move closer to Jesus as we prepare to follow Him on the Way of the Cross.

Both of these programs are appropriate for beginners, or people who have not had the opportunity to learn more about their faith. At the same time, they are appropriate for all of us who want to deepen our faith and our relationship with God.



My name is Nikki Strusowski, I currently work in the sales department at Corporation Service Company as a small business consultant. In my free time I enjoy hanging out with my friends and family and of course with my two dogs. I am engaged to the man of my dreams, Gunnar Kaczmarczyk, who has inspired me to take the next steps to explore my Catholic faith before our marriage this fall.

Growing up my Dad's side of the family actively attended St. John the Beloved School and were members of the parish. It was something I always wanted to be apart of but just never took the extra steps to complete. My fiancé (boyfriend at the time) and I frequently talked about our future and how we wanted to get married in the church and baptize & raise our children in the Catholic community. Once we got engaged I

knew it was time to take those next steps. Knowing that we wanted to raise our future family Catholic and get married in the church I couldn't think of a better time to complete my RCIA. Gunnar, my fiancé, was excited when I told him that I wanted to become Catholic and he assured me he would help any way possible and go through the journey with me. He attends every class with me and supports me in every way possible, I really couldn't get luckier finding a support system like him.

The RCIA process has been enjoyable to say the least. I enjoy going to class every Monday and reflecting on what we talk about. By learning to acknowledge the presence of God in my life, I have grown as an individual. I have learned to let things go and to reflect that there is really always a purpose for everything. I have learned that through the good times and bad, through the fun life decisions, and through the tough ones there is a plan for the decision I choose and the route my life takes. I think acknowledging that route has allowed me to view life a little differently and not get so worked up in small things but to look at the larger picture. I am learning to put any obstacle in God's hands and to trust that the correct result will come from it and that it will shape me into the individual that I am meant to be.

Participating in Mass is something I look forward to on Sundays or Saturday evenings. 
