

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



The first readings for the Sundays of Lent present various covenants. This Sunday our focus is on Abraham and the Covenant of Faith. Although we use the term "faith" in many ways, the most important use is our complete trust in God. This is the faith that Abraham had in God. He was told by God to sacrifice his son Isaac, yet he was also told that he would be the father of many nations. Logically, how could this happen? This Divine request was incomprehensible and an abomination because human sacrifice was not permitted.

This episode was truly a test of Abraham's faith. Abraham's decision to sacrifice his son, Isaac, prefigured the Father's decision to sacrifice the Son, Jesus. Abraham trusted in God, and God made with him the covenant of faith. Abraham is the prototype of all believers.

Lent is the perfect time to realize that God takes care of you. The very fact that we were called into existence is no mistake. Yes, challenges appear insurmountable at times, when faith appears weak. It is then that we read a little further in today's Gospel and repeat what the man says in Mark 9:24: "I do believe Lord. Help those parts of me that don't believe." And we trust in God to form with us, as He did with Abraham, a covenant of faith.



The Church recommends three basis disciplines during Lent. One of them is Fasting and another is **Prayer.**

Prayer is the communication we have between God and ourselves. Jesus, Himself, was a man of constant prayer. He meditated in the early hours of the morning, attended synagogue worship and fulfilled the prayerful gestures in the Temple.

We have the opportunity, with the pandemic restricting our social time, to pray more privately at home and elsewhere; instead of wasting time on less important things. Mass is the perfect prayer and attending daily Mass is rewarding. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament takes place on Fridays after the 8:00 Mass to 10:00 a.m. Stations of the Cross on Fridays at 7 p.m. is also a strong prayerful way to join the Lord in His Passion. Devotional prayers, like the rosary, are disciplines that place us before the Lord. Private meditation on Sacred Scripture and spiritual readings are also highly recommended forms of prayer.

Pray, Pray, Pray... it is the exact way to keep the Covenant of love alive and vibrant between God and ourselves. **More at SJBDE.org/Lent.**

Fish on Friday... Q: Why do Catholics eat fish on Friday?

A: For centuries, meatless Fridays were the norm for Catholics throughout the world. Friday was chosen because that was the day on which Jesus died, and Christians wanted to find a way to honor that day with special prayers and acts of penance and self-denial. The practice of abstaining from meat on Fridays — under pain of sin — grew out of that desire, and it became an official part of Church teaching until the time of the Second Vatican Council.

In the 1960s, there was a shift in the Church's thinking, in large part because there was a recognition that differences in cultures and economic realities meant that eating or not eating meat had different meanings for different peoples. For example, in cultures that were largely dependent on seafood or a vegetarian diet, abstaining from meat was no sacrifice at all. While in other places, eating fish and other kinds of seafood was actually something rare and special and not a sacrifice. This was all part of a basic reflection on "why we do what we do" among the Church's pastors.

Today, Catholics throughout the world are still instructed to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent. The bishops of some countries, such as in England and Wales, ask Catholics to abstain from meat every Friday, continuing the older tradition. The Bishops of the United States have taken a slightly different approach, encouraging Catholics to honor Friday as a special day by abstaining from meat every Friday or by taking on some other work of penance or charity for the sake of others.

Regardless of what we choose to do, the real value in all of this is to see a reflection of Good Friday in each Friday, to remember the self-giving love of Jesus, and to honor that love through some sort of sacrifice or act of mercy. ©LPi

INSPIRE

The Year of Saint Joseph —Though Luke's Gospel does not present Joseph's role with the same emphasis as Matthew does, this does not necessarily mean that he sees that role as different or less important.

In Luke 1:27, Mary is first introduced as "a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph," before her name is given. Throughout Luke 2, Joseph is constantly mentioned with Mary by name or as father or parent together with her. Joseph plays a key supporting role throughout Luke's Gospel. He is Mary's betrothed during the virginal conception, and though never directly called her husband, after conception he is presented together with her as the Davidic and protective father of Jesus. He is a pious Jew faithful to the Mosaic Law.

In Luke's Gospel, Joseph appears in scenes not found in Matthew or elsewhere in Scripture, such as the census, the adoration of the shepherds,

the presentation in the Temple, and the later finding in the Temple with the adolescent Jesus speaking of His heavenly Father in the context of obedience to His earthly father (Luke 2:41-51). This is the last we hear of Christ's childhood and Joseph's physical presence in Luke.

John's Gospel mentions Joseph in only two verses, 1:45 and 6:42, and Mark's Gospel not at all.

Independent audit finds Diocese of Wilmington in compliance with Charter.

The Catholic Diocese of Wilmington has once again been found to be in compliance with the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*, the comprehensive action plan adopted by the U.S. bishops in 2002 to effectively deal with sexual abuse of minors by members of the clergy and other church personnel. The findings are a result of a review of data collected for the 2019/2020 *Charter* audit period by StoneBridge Business Partners, an independent firm hired by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. The Diocese of Wilmington has been found to be in compliance in all audits including its first audit in 2004.

Currently, there are approximately 11,000 active individuals – including clergy, deacons and parish and school staff and volunteers – that have undergone background checks and have been cleared for ministry with young people in the Diocese of Wilmington through its *For the Sake of God's Children* safe environment program.


