A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Traditions are important. They create familiarity, a sense of continuity and belonging. They reinforce values. But sometimes they can get in the way of what truly matters. In today's passage, Jesus once again steps on some favorite traditions when the Pharisees find fault in Jesus' disciples who did not observe washing their hands before eating. This ceremonial washing was more symbolic than hygienic. Along with the washing of outside objects, this tradition was to keep the person religiously purified. These rules were not even derived from Scripture, so Jesus rebukes them for giving too much weight to the "tradition."

Jesus called the Pharisees hypocrites because they honored God outwardly and not inwardly. They were zealous to honor God through their own traditions, but ignored God's explicit guidelines for honoring Him – His Commandments. For example, Hebrew sons were allowed, by a traditional technicality in a vow, to

ignore helping their parents with possessions or savings. So they let human ritual take precedence over the Fourth Commandment.

According to Jesus, what is essential to true worship is drawing near to God with your heart, not just mouthing words of praise. What is Christ's main point here? Ceremonially unclean hands or foods do not affect your heart. It's not what you put in your body, but what comes out of your heart that matters to God. And Jesus lists the many evils that "come from inside and make a man unclean." Sin springs from hatred and selfishness within a person and takes its expression in the terrible actions: fornication, murder, theft, adultery, etc. Virtue springs from hearts full of the love of God and responds with charity, kindness, and upright decent behavior.

Like the Pharisees, we sometimes overemphasize the less important pieces of the puzzle and forget the heart of the matter. The motivation for our actions as Christians must be hearts full of love for God that motivates good actions from us. What matters is what is inside of us. So...

Be careful of your thoughts, for your thoughts become your words.

Be careful of your words, for your words become your actions.

Be careful of your actions, for your actions become your habits.

Be careful of your <u>habits</u>, for your <u>habits</u> become your character.

Be careful of your character, for your character becomes your destiny.




Missionaries with Focus at the University of Connecticut. Luke Duchemin is pictured on the right with his former team.
