

LENT AT SAINT JOHN THE BELOVED



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

How are you living your **Lent?** This season of the liturgical year is a time for us to reflect on what it means to be Christian and how we might more effectively witness to Christ.

Lent and all things Lenten are good news! For Christians, the lengthening days of Lent herald for us the saving death and resurrection of Christ our Light! It's time to brighten our spiritual days by turning away from sin and re-embracing the Gospel as we prepare for the celebration of new life — Easter!—in six weeks' time.

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. Make sure the holist of days are marked on your calendar so that you may be a part of these sacred liturgies.

Daily Mass

In addition to Mass on Sunday (and Saturday evening), the center of our life as Catholic Christians, there is Mass in the parish each day Monday through Saturday at 8 a.m. If daily Mass is not part of your regular routine, consider adding it to your Lenten practice.

Stations of the Cross

On Fridays during Lent and on Good Friday, the Stations of the Cross will be prayed at 7:00 p.m. in the Church. This will include a Living Stations of the Cross presented by the 8th graders of Saint John the Beloved School on April 11. On March 14, March 28, and April 11 please consider joining the Knights of Columbus for a Fish Fry Dinner from 5 to 7:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall prior to Stations.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

There are eight remaining opportunities to participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation before Easter here at Saint John the Beloved. Catholics are obligated to confess serious sins at least once a year and, if having committed a mortal sin without yet having been to Confession, are not to receive Holy Communion until they receive sacramental absolution. (Catechism #1457)

LENTEN DISCIPLINES OF FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

Liturgy of the Word

FIRST READING Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18 The Lord God took Abram outside and said, "Look up at the sky and count the stars, if you can. Just so," he added, "shall your descendants be." Abram put his faith in the LORD, who credited it to him as an act of righteousness.

He then said to him, "I am the LORD who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans to give you this land as a possession." "O Lord GOD," he asked, "how am I to know that I shall possess it?" He answered him, "Bring me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old she-goat, a three-year-old ram, a turtledove, and a young pigeon." Abram brought him all these, split them in two, and placed each half opposite the other; but the birds he did not cut up. Birds of prey swooped down on the carcasses, but Abram stayed with them. As the sun was about to set, a trance fell upon

Abram, and a deep, terrifying darkness enveloped him

When the sun had set and it was dark, there appeared a smoking fire pot and a flaming torch, which passed between those pieces. 


