PASTORAL CORNER

Pastor's Perspective: Come to the feast of heaven and earth

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Thank you very much! To everyone who was involved in any way with last Friday's special Mass which conferred papal honors upon Monsignor Frank Murray and Monsignor Jean-Paul Labrie, please know of my heartfelt gratitude. So many people came together to create, under the inspiration and guidance of the Holy Spirit, a wonderful experience that praised the Lord for the priestly ministry of two former pastors and diocesan priests.

Many individuals approached me to express their awe and appreciation for the amazingly beautiful worship experience

and the thoroughly delightful dinner-reception. Of course, I acknowledged the generosity and sacrifice of everyone who out of faith and love, in both seen and unseen ways, contributed their time and talents to the "success" of this grace-filled evening. I put "success" in quotes because if we glorified God for his abundant goodness to us (e.g., for our life and salvation, for his gifts of Eucharist and priesthood, for his blessing of communion and

community, etc.), then it was a "success." Thanks be to God.

Sadly, so many people do not experience communion and community. They feel alone, isolated and ignored; they are marginalized, oppressed and rejected. Too often, they also know emotional and spiritual pain. But it doesn't have to be that way!

As Catholics, we have the precious grace of holding in our hands and receiving in our hearts, the merciful Fount of all healing, hope, and wholeness – Jesus himself. With our brothers and sisters in Christ, we touch and taste the Creator

and Redeemer of the entire universe in a uniquely intimate manner. The Mass is the source from which all graces flow (because it is the saving sacrifice of Christ made present for us) and the summit to which all people are called to come together and be strengthened and nourished on the feast of God's Word and Sacraments.

That is why, at its heart, the essence of the Eucharist has never been about private worship or individualistic devotions. Yes, of course, our central act of worship does evoke a deeply personal experience of prayer because the Lord always speaks to each one of our hearts, to our specific circumstances, to our

own joys and sorrows. But Christ has chosen to act through, with, and in the context of Christian community (his Body, which is the Church). The Mass brings about unity with God (his glorification) and one another (our sanctification). Through the institution of the

Eucharist at the Last Supper, Jesus prayed for this unity, "I pray not only for them…so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us" (*John 17:20-21*).

Extend God's offer of gracious hospitality to your family, friends, neighbors, and coworkers. Invite them to "come to the feast of heaven and earth" at St. Paul the Apostle Parish, where communion and community in the Risen Lord is alive and well.

DID YOU KNOW?

Happy Birthday to the Virgin Mary. Why aren't we celebrating?

This week, on Monday, September 8, we observe the Blessed Virgin Mary's birthday, but don't expect a big party at any local parish. While the birthday is often acknowledged, it is not celebrated. This is because there are other events in the life of the Virgin Mary that the Church considers more important. Chief among those is the assumption of Mary into heaven, which is like a second birthday celebrating a saint's arrival in heaven. The first birthday is ordinary, but the second birthday is truly glorious.

There are other reasons why her birthday is not celebrated. Little is known of her birth. We know she was born to saints Joachim and Anne. We know she was born without sin. Saint Anne may not have suffered the pain of childbirth in bearing Mary. But everything else is speculation. So, should we celebrate Our Lady's birthday? Because there are greater feasts associated with Our Lady, there is little need to celebrate this, the least of her holidays. However, there is no reason why you can't.

How do you celebrate Our Lady's birthday? When giving gifts, it is important to give the recipient something they would like. Our Lady is fond of sincere devotion to her son, Jesus Christ. She loves acts of mercy, compassion and kindness. Perhaps the greatest gift we can give Mary is to love one another as her Son commanded us. Perform an act of charity today and offer it up to Our Lady. Teach your family and friends about Our Lady and her role in Christ's life. More importantly, show people your love for Mary by behaving in a manner pleasing to her. Let others see Our Lady in your many acts of mercy and compassion. A New Generation of Saints: Carlo Acutis and Pier Giorgio Frassati Canonized September 7



In a world longing for authentic witnesses of holiness, two young lives are set to light the way for a new generation of Catholics. Pope Leo XIV has confirmed that Carlo Acutis and Pier Giorgio Frassati will be canonized together on September 7, 2025, during the Church's Holy Year—a moment that will mark the first time a millennial becomes a saint.

Carlo Acutis (shown on left), born in London in 1991 and raised in Milan, embraced a deep love for the Eucharist from an early age. "To always be united to Jesus: This is my life plan," he once told his mother after receiving his First Communion, according to Catholic News Agency (CNA). Carlo was not only devoted to daily Mass and acts of

kindness—he was also a tech-savvy teenager who used his digital skills to evangelize. His Eucharistic Miracles website, which catalogued over 100 documented cases of Eucharistic phenomena, has since traveled to thousands of parishes worldwide. His beatification in 2020 made him the first millennial to be declared "Blessed." Now, just 19 years after his death from leukemia at age 15, he will be canonized—a process that historically took centuries.

Joining Carlo in sainthood is another beloved figure among the faithful—Pier Giorgio Frassati (shown on right). Born in 1901 in Turin, Italy, and beatified in 1990 by Pope John Paul II, Frassati was a mountaineer, student, and tireless servant of the poor. His motto, Verso l'Alto—"to the heights"—reflects both his love of mountain climbing and his spiritual aspiration toward heaven. Frassati contracted polio at the age of 24, likely from his charitable work among the sick. He died on July 4, 1925, and his legacy has endured among Catholic youth movements and service organizations around the world. "Entirely immersed in the mystery of God and totally dedicated to the constant service of his neighbor," Pope John Paul II once said of him.

The decision to canonize both men on the same day, and during the Church's Jubilee of Youth, highlights the Vatican's desire to place young, relatable models of holiness before today's faithful. The ceremony will take place in St. Peter's Square and is expected to draw pilgrims from across the globe.


