

# Pastor's Perspective: In honor of God's humble servant

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

If you have occasion to drive by St. John Church, you will notice a new addition to the landscape: a simple yet dignified granite bench to honor our beloved pastor-emeritus and native son, Msgr. Frank Murray. The bench has

been installed near the front entryway.

Shortly after the announcement that Pope Francis had conferred the title of "Monsignor" upon him, a group of his personal friends approached me to ask whether they could purchase and install a bench in front of St. John – the church located in the neighborhood of his upbringing. It is



here that he grew in "wisdom, age, and grace" and discerned his call to the priesthood.

After receiving permission from Bishop James Ruggieri, the group collected their funds, including a donation from the Knights of Columbus for whom Msgr. Murray serves as Chaplain. Since then, the bench has been purchased, engraved, and installed.

We are in the process of coordinating a convenient date and time (before the snow flies, we hope) at which a simple blessing of the bench will take place. Of course, in the spring, our dedicated volunteer gardeners will ensure that the bench is appropriately surrounded by beautiful flowers.

Once again, we congratulate Msgr. Murray on the honor bestowed upon him at the request of Bishop Ruggieri and approved by Pope Francis. His humble, generous, and gracious ministry to the faithful of this parish and diocese is worthy of recognition and imitation by all who aspire to serve as a priest of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Thank you, Fr. Murray, for being a faithful yet gentle preacher of the Gospel, a reverent yet generous celebrant of Christ's sacraments, and a strong yet pastoral shepherd to God's people.

# The Liturgy: Are you all in?

s a deacon candidate for the Diocese of Portland, I just Completed the course, Theology of the Liturgy. In every liturgy of the Church, we celebrate the Paschal Mystery by which Jesus Christ achieved our salvation, especially in the sacrament of the Eucharist, the source and summit of our faith. One thing that resonated with me during the course was the spirit of "conscious, active, and fruitful participation" required of everyone in the liturgy, as stated in paragraph 1071 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Paragraph 11 of Sacrosanctum Concilium (Constitution on

the Sacred Liturgy of the Second Vatican Council) states that for the liturgy to have its full impact, the faithful must participate with the right mindset and cooperate with divine grace. At the same time, pastors of souls ensure that the faithful are fully aware of what they are doing, actively involved in the rite, and spiritually enriched by its effects.

Authentic ritual prayer (i.e., Liturgy of the Hours, Liturgy of the Mass), shapes and forms us as individuals and as a community.

Pope Francis, in paragraph 39 of Desiderio Desideravi, states there are two aspects of liturgical formation: "formation for the liturgy and formation by the liturgy. The first depends upon the second, which is essential." In other words, we can be formed both through our study of and participation in the liturgy. The words and gestures of the liturgy are not our own; they come to us from the Church's tradition. We need to surrender to these words and gestures with faith and adoration, through the ritual actions, and to Christ himself.

At times, I am distracted during Mass and not always fully engaged in faithful active participation, even on days when I am serving. Our priests are human, and they, too, can get distracted. This is part of our human condition. But our shortcomings should not prevent us from striving to do our best and from actively engaging in every Mass. Do we arrive early for Mass with the right prayerful attitude and mindset?

Do we speak the correct words, sing the hymns, embrace the silence, and make the proper gestures as asked of us by the Church - reflecting the unity that the liturgy demands of us?

> Are we in awe of Jesus Christ in his Word and in the Eucharist, present on the altar and in the tabernacle? When we are dismissed at the end of Mass with the words, "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord" or "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life," do we take them as the Lord's marching orders to bring Christ to the world in service of our brothers and sisters?

When I have the opportunity to serve with Father Matthew Valles on Friday evenings, I always appreciate the prayer he recites in

the sacristy with all the servers before the start of Mass. It goes something like this: "Priest of God, celebrate this Mass as if it is your first Mass, your last Mass, and your only Mass." This is an excellent prayer for everyone – clergy and laity – to recite and practice. We, the People of God, through our baptism, need to be "all-in" through our full and active participation at every Mass. Whenever we actively participate in each Mass as if it were our first, last, and only Mass, then our liturgy and formation fulfill their divine potential. Are you ready to be all-in?

# Why we commemorate All Souls Day

Il Souls Day is a holy day set aside for honoring the dead. According to Catholic belief, the soul of a person who dies can go to one of three places. The first is heaven, where a person who dies in a state of perfect grace and communion with God goes. The second is hell, where those who die in a state of mortal sin are naturally condemned by their choice. The intermediate option is purgatory, which is thought to be where most people, free of mortal sin, but still in a state of lesser (venial) sin, must go. Purgatory is necessary so that souls can be cleansed and perfected before they enter into heaven.

Consistent with these teachings and traditions, Catholics believe that through the prayers of the faithful on Earth, the dead are cleansed of their sins so they may enter into heaven.

The belief in purgatory has not been without controversy. Certainly, some flagrant abuses of the doctrine were used to raise money for the Church during the renaissance. Famously, Martin Luther argued with the monk, Johan Tetzel, over the

sale of indulgences. Indulgences were sold as spiritual pardons to the poor and applied to the souls of the dead (or the living) to get people into heaven. The abuse of indulgences and the blatant, sometimes fraudulent practice of selling indulgences for money, led to Luther's protest.


All Souls Day is celebrated in much of the western world on November 2. Other rites have their own celebrations. The Eastern Orthodox Church has several such days throughout the year, mostly on Saturdays. All Souls Day is not a holy day of obligation. It should not be confused with All Saints' Day, which is a holy day of obligation. One exception is this year, as it happens to fall on a Saturday.

Many cultures also mark the day differently. In North America, Americans may say extra prayers or light candles for the departed. In parts of Latin America, families visit the graves of their ancestors and sometimes leave food offerings for the departed.




