PASTORAL CORNER

Pastor's Perspective: An Invitation to Mary and to Mercy



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,
March 25 - Annunciation of the Lord: The Annunciation, although not observed as a holy day of obligation, is ranked nonetheless as the highest of liturgical feasts – a solemnity. As recounted in St. Luke's Gospel (1:26-28), the Lord sends the archangel Gabriel to announce his invitation to the

Virgin Mary to be the Mother of the Son of God.

- Mary's fiat is an act of humility, fidelity, and obedience ... an act of faith, hope, and charity.
- Mary's "Yes!" is a model for all Christians who desire to fulfill their vocation in accordance with God's will.
- Mary's acceptance – "May it be done to me according to your word!" – inaugurates God's salvific mission.
- Mary's approval is a pivotal moment in the history of salvation – "The Word was made flesh" (Incarnation).

Join us as we celebrate with the greatest solemnity this sacred mystery of our faith on Wednesday, March 25: 8:30 am at St. Mary Church; 8:30 at St. John Church; and 5:30 pm at St. Matthew Church.

Reminder – Expanded Confessions Times: During Lent, Christians are invited to perform acts of prayer and penance (i.e., fasting and almsgiving) as a way of renewing our relationship with the Crucified and Risen Lord. Having drawn closer to Jesus through our Lenten observances,

the Church also invites us to take part in one final act of penance: humbly admitting our need for forgiveness through the Sacrament of Confession (also known as Penance). To undertake this sacrifice is a genuine act of faith and trust in Christ, the Divine Mercy of God.

In advance of Holy Week, I invite you to experience the joy of being reconciled to the Lord Jesus and his Body, the Church. Please see page 2 of this bulletin for a complete schedule of the dates, times, locations, and number of priests available for confessions.

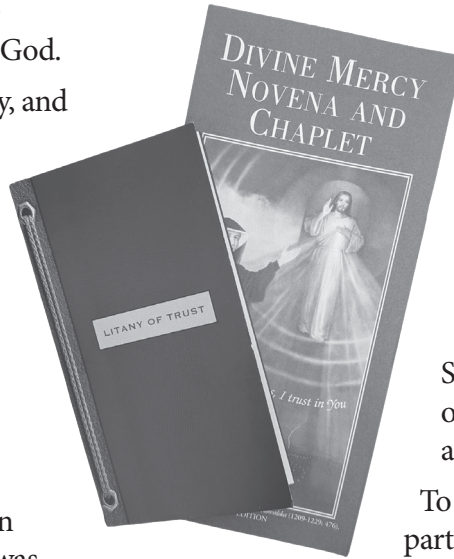
Coming Soon – Divine Mercy Novena:

Divine Mercy Sunday will be celebrated on Sunday, April 12 (also known as the Second Sunday of Easter). On this solemnity, the Risen Lord greets his apostles with peace and breathes on them, offering them the gift of the Holy Spirit and "ordaining" them to forgive the sins of others. Mercy received must manifest itself as mercy shared!

To prepare for this feast, we invite you to take part in praying the devotion known as the Divine Mercy Novena, which begins, appropriately so, on Good Friday (April 3) and continues through

Saturday, April 11. Last year, we attached a copy of the Divine Mercy Novena pamphlet to everyone's bulletins; this year, copies are available on the pamphlet stands at all our churches. (On these stands, you will also find copies of "The Litany of Trust" by the Sisters of Life, a brief yet beautiful prayer of abandonment to Christ's love, guidance, and providence.)

DID YOU KNOW?

The Good Thief — Luke 23:39-43

The Passion, Death and Resurrection of our Lord will soon be upon us as we approach the end of the season of Lent. In Luke's Gospel narrative of the Passion, (23:39-43) he recounts the words of the man who was crucified beside Jesus and became known as the "Good Thief."

At one point this man acknowledges his sinfulness saying to the other criminal suffering crucifixion, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed justly; for we are receiving the due reward of our deeds; but this man has done nothing wrong." Then he turns to Jesus with contrition saying, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Jesus replies, "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." As we remember why Jesus came, that is, to save us all from our sins and

grant us eternal life, let us remember this interaction and turn to Jesus as we acknowledge our sins before him. I have used those words, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom," many times as I've gazed upon the crucifix. His beautiful promise that we will share heaven with him is all because of his love for us. We can do nothing to earn our way to heaven, but we can turn to Jesus, acknowledge our sinfulness, and ask for forgiveness like the Good Thief. The love Jesus showed us by giving completely of himself that we might have life eternal with him is waiting for us. We only need to respond as we confess our sins. Take some time to meditate on those words, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." May we turn to him with all our hearts and hear his response, "You will be with me in Paradise."

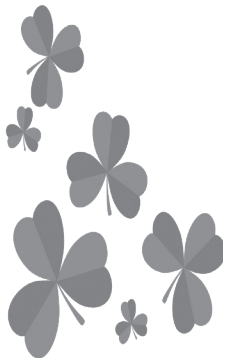

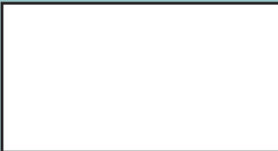
