THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Baptisms are

THE SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Arrangements must be made at least 1 year in advance. Preparations include sessions with a member of the clergy and attendance at a Pre-Cana Conference. For more information, please call the Parish Office.

THE SACRAMENT OF THE SICK:

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. A careful judgment about the serious nature of an illness is sufficient. "Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived."¹³⁰

ASCENSION OF THE LORD

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

Jesus had appeared many times to His disciples after his resurrection. On this final occasion, Jesus' departing message is that they will soon receive the Holy Spirit to strengthen them in their work. No sooner does he say this, He is taken up to heaven before their eyes.

Second Reading: Ephesians 1:17-23

Paul prays that God may grant wisdom and enlightenment to the Ephesians so that they may know the great hope to which they are called. Every power has been given to Christ who now reigns in heaven. He is the "head of the church, which is His body."

Gospel: Luke 24:46-53

Jesus tells His disciples that with His death and resurrection scripture has been fulfilled. As witnesses, when the Holy Spirit comes upon them, they will go out and teach in the name of Jesus, repentance and forgiveness to all nations. Then Jesus led them out, raised His hands and blessed them and was taken into Heaven.

Consider & Reflect

"Thus, it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things, but wait in the city until you are clothed with power from on high."

The passage summarizes the paschal mystery of what was, we have waited, the power has been conferred, now it is my turn to act. The power of the Holy Spirit came at Pentecost, came to me through my baptism and confirmation, but needs to be exercised, put into action. Don't let it lie dormant, but become awakened to the power I possess to do good for the Lord. Surely I know someone who needs to be encouraged, supported, and become my partner in living the faith the Lord has chosen for me.

This Jubilee Year also provides a unique opportunity to recognize and celebrate the distinct ministries, charisms, and gifts of the Holy Spirit that these movements and communities bring to the Church. Their diverse expressions of faith and commitment enrich the spiritual tapestry of our dioceses, offering fresh perspectives and innovative approaches to evangelization and pastoral care. By embracing their unique contributions, we celebrate the unity in diversity that is a hallmark of the mystical Body of Christ that is the Catholic Church, acknowledging that each movement and community, regardless of its size or influence, plays a vital role in the Church's mission.

• Servant of God Joseph Cardijn (1882-1967), Belgian cardinal and founder of the Young Christian Workers movement, dedicated to social activism and evangelization, and contributor to the Second Vatican Council. Developed "See, Judge, Act," an influential model for many associations and lay movements.

• Bl. (soon St.) Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901-1925, feast day July 4), patron of young people and World Youth Day, an active member of the Catholic Action movement in Italy, and a third order Dominican. He was called the "man of the beatitudes" by St. John Paul II for his humble commitment to living Gospel values and spirituality in everyday life. He is set to be canonized during the 2025 Jubilee Holy Year.

KNIGHT'S KORNER #17

It's hard to believe that it's already been three years since our friend and Pastor Fr. Mick passed away. I remember one of my last conversations with him vividly. We were out to lunch and I asked him about the bells that are rung at Mass. I said "Fr. Mick, when the Eucharist is raised and the bells are rung three times, is that in deference to the Father, Son and Holy Spirit?" He looked at me and with a long drawn out Texas drawl simply said "no." I then asked if it had any significance to the three times that Peter denied Christ. He looked at me again, and said, "Weren't you an altar boy? Haven't you been a Catholic for the last 60+ years?" He then went into a dissertation on what the bells signify in the Catholic Church. Here is my recollection of the last conversation with Fr. Mick, and what the bells in the Catholic Church mean.

To answer my specific question, the sound of bells at the consecration is intended to draw the congregation into a state of reverence and awe. His exact words were *"stay awake stupid, something special is happening here."*

He went on to say that some interpret bell ringing as a symbolic connection to heaven, echoing the trumpets sounded by angels in the Book of Revelation. Other uses of bells include calling the faithful to Mass, particularly before Sunday Masses. He told me that many churches ring bells three times a day to mark the Angelus, a prayer invoking the Annunciation and Mary's role in the Incarnation. Fr. Mick had more to say, but he saw my eyes glazing over and mercifully told me that was enough for the day.

He died shortly thereafter and never got to finish. I think of Fr. Mick every time I hear the bells rung and offer a prayer of thanks for bringing him to the Parish of St. Theresa.


