THE SACRAMENT OF THE SICK

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. A careful judgment about the serious nature of an illness is sufficient. "*Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived.*"¹³⁰

SAINTS PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES

First Reading: Acts 12: 1-11

King Herod began to harass some of the members of the Church. James, brother of John, was beheaded. Peter was arrested and imprisoned. Through the power of an angel, light shown in the cell and Peter's chains fell from his wrists. Peter followed the angel to safety and was convinced that the angel was sent by God to save him from Herod.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 17-18

"I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith," Timothy writes. We hear in this reading the longing for the day of God's reign and how salvation is near. God will continue to rescue us and keep us from harm.

Gospel: Matthew 16:13-19

When Jesus asks His disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" Peter exclaims, "You are the Messiah!" Christ then declares that Peter is the "Rock upon which He will build His Church" promising Peter the power "to bind" and "to lose".

Consider & Reflect

"But Peter looked intently and said, 'Look at us.' He paid attention to them, expecting to receive something from them. Peter said, 'I have neither silver nor gold, but what I do have I give you: in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazorean, rise and walk.' Then Peter took him by the right hand and raised him up, and immediately his feet and ankles grew strong. He leaped up, and stood, and walked around, and went into the temple with them, walking and jumping and praising God."

We honor the two great Apostles together, Peter and Paul, the former our first Pope and the second the apostle to the gentiles. The scripture accounts of Peter's commissioning, his triumphs and disasters are well known. The journeys and letters of Paul are fourteen books of the bible teaching and forming us and were written even before the gospel texts which we treasure. May Peter's words and actions be mirrored as we have something to give those cripples in our lives. May we respond by giving them the Jesus we know as we reflect His person to our world. What we have is ours to give – the person of Jesus by our kindness, caring and willingness to reach out to them. Saint Mother Teresa is the model from our own time and experience. "Look at us."

Rev. Selvam Johnson Gerald Asirvatham,

lovingly known as Fr. Gerry, was born and raised in India, where his spiritual journey was deeply rooted in a strong family foundation and a vibrant faith tradition. Though he lost his beloved parents a decade ago, their legacy of love and devotion lives on through him and his close-knit family, which includes four sisters, one brother, and a cherished circle of 11 nieces and nephews.

Fr. Gerry pursued his vocation with dedication, completing his Seminary formation along with Bachelor's and Master's degrees in History. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1993 and began his ministry in his home diocese, where he faithfully served for ten years, first as Vice Rector of the Minor Seminary, nurturing the faith of future priests, and later as Pastor of two rural parishes.

In 2003, Fr. Gerry was called to extend his pastoral mission beyond borders, arriving in the United States to serve in the **Diocese of Trenton**, where he has joyfully ministered for the past 22 years. In 2009, he earned a Master's degree in Theology from Georgian Court University, enhancing his ability to teach, preach, and shepherd souls with clarity and wisdom.

Fr. Gerry is known not only for his powerful and inspiring homilies that speak to both heart and mind, but also for his infectious sense of humor that brings joy to those around him. His life is a beautiful balance of ministry and mindfulness. He finds peace and creativity in his many hobbies, which include cooking, gardening, health and wellness, fitness, photography, singing, listening to music, and traveling, each a reflection of his appreciation for the beauty and wonder of God's creation. *We look forward to getting to know Fr. In the Catholic Church, priests are ordained men who share in the ministry of Christ through their preaching and administration of the sacraments in their diocese, eparchy or religious institute or society of apostolic life. The office of the priesthood, instituted by Christ and passed down through the apostles, conforms men to "Christ the Priest in such a way that they can act in the person of Christ the Head". Through their preaching, prayer, and celebration of the sacraments, priests guide the body of Christ to the Father. Priests serve God "in the midst of the flock where they adore Him in spirit and in truth," offering their voluntary poverty, chastity, and obedience as a sacrifice to God. The practice of the evangelical counsels serves as a means for priests to reach the perfection of charity. Priests grow in charity in a particular way through the celebration of the Eucharist, which brings about "a bond of priestly perfection which draws their life and activity to unity and coordination". A priest's life images the life of Christ when centered around the Eucharist: a life dedicated to bringing others to the Father out of an unwavering love of God himself.

PRAYER for Priests

Gracious and loving God, we thank you for the gift of our priests. Through them, we experience your presence in the sacraments. Help our priests to be strong in their vocation. Set their souls on fire with love for your people. Grant them the wisdom, understanding, and strength they need to follow in the footsteps of Jesus. Inspire them with the vision of your Kingdom. Give them the words they need to spread the Gospel. Allow them to experience joy in their ministry. Help them to become instruments of your divine grace. We ask this through Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns as our Eternal Priest. Amen.




