## THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

#### THE SACRAMENT OF THE SICK

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. A careful judgment about the serious nature of an illness is sufficient. "*Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived.*"<sup>130</sup>

We welcome anyone who has a physical condition, is anticipating entering the hospital for surgery or tests, or under any emotional distress to avail them of this beautiful Sacrament. Please call the Parish Office to schedule the Sacrament with a priest. Please do not wait until the very last minute to call.

# FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY <u>TIME</u>

## First Reading: Isaiah 66:10-14c

Isaiah instructs the people of Jerusalem to rejoice, because God would restore her prosperity. People will better understand God's power through the restoration of their homeland.

## Second Reading: Galatians 6:14-18

Paul describes the sign of the cross of Jesus as all that is significant. Following the old laws is unimportant. Instead, being baptized in Christ and adhering to His ideals is what matters most.

## Gospel: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

Jesus sent forth seventy-two disciples to preach His Good News, telling them, "*The harvest is rich, but the workers are few.*" He also provided them with detailed instructions on how to interact with the people. Jesus then reminded them not to be happy because of their power over evil, but to rejoice in the salvation they would achieve.

#### **Consider & Reflect**

"At that time Jesus appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. He said, 'the harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few, so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on your way; behold I am sending you like lambs among wolves.""

As I read the gospel passage, I realize that the seventy-two were not sufficient to complete the mission. It was only the beginning. We might think a missionary is one who joins a group and is sent to bring the good news of Jesus to another region or country. That is a limited understanding of the role of a Catholic. Because of my baptism my name is added to the seventy-two, as I am commissioned to go on mission. Why? The harvest is ready but as long as I just sit on the sidelines and watch, I am allowing the wolves to devour the sheep. Are you ready to be recommissioned? Pope Saint John Paul II told us '*The mission of Christ the redeemer which He entrusted to His church is far from completion.*' Make it 73!

## Rev. Selvam Johnson Gerald Asirvatham,

lovingly known as Fr. Gerry, was born and raised in India, where his spiritual journey was deeply rooted in a strong family foundation and a vibrant faith tradition. Though he lost his beloved parents a decade ago, their legacy of love and devotion lives on through him and his close-knit family, which includes four sisters, one brother, and a cherished circle of 11 nieces and nephews.

Fr. Gerry pursued his vocation with dedication, completing his Seminary formation along with Bachelor's and Master's degrees in History. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1993 and began his ministry in his home diocese, where he faithfully served for ten years, first as Vice Rector of the Minor Seminary, nurturing the faith of future priests, and later as Pastor of two rural parishes.

In 2003, Fr. Gerry was called to extend his pastoral mission beyond borders, arriving in the United States to serve in the **Diocese of Trenton**, where he has joyfully ministered for the past 22 years. In 2009, he earned a Master's degree in Theology from Georgian Court University, enhancing his ability to teach, preach, and shepherd souls with clarity and wisdom.

Fr. Gerry is known not only for his powerful and inspiring homilies that speak to both heart and mind, but also for his infectious sense of humor that brings joy to those around him. His life is a beautiful balance of ministry and mindfulness. He finds peace and creativity in his many hobbies, which include cooking, gardening, health and wellness, fitness, photography, singing, listening to music, and traveling, each a reflection of his appreciation for the beauty and wonder of God's creation. *We look forward to getting to know Fr. Gerry and working with him in our community.*

# July 4th Edition

On July 4, 1776, the Continental Congress formally adopted the Declaration of Independence, proclaiming the United States of America's independence from Great Britain. Throughout America's 249-year history many patriots shed blood and gave the ultimate sacrifice in this quest for freedom and independence. Countless air, land and sea victories have indeed made and kept America "the land of the free and the home of the brave." Today we acknowledge and honor two patriots, one past and one present who have continued this lineage of service to our homeland.

John Nowak served in the U.S. Navy for 20 years. He was an active participant in the 1962 Cuban Missile Crisis which blockaded Cuban ports in order to keep Russian missiles out of Cuba. He was then assigned at the onset of the Vietnam War to Saigon, where he served as a naval instructor at the Small Boat School. Upon completion of his overseas tours, John returned to the states and played an integral part in the commissioning of the Dwight D. Eisenhower nuclear powered aircraft carrier in Newport News, Va. John was honorably discharged in 1982.

From the time she was in junior high school in Williamsport, Pa., **Amanda Southard** dreamed of attending West Point. Due to her stellar academic credentials and athletic accomplishments (3-time high school tennis champion) Amanda was accepted into West Point while still a junior in high school. Upon her 2021 West Point graduation, Amanda attended helicopter training at Ft. Rucker in Enterprise, Alabama, and then was assigned to Ft. Bliss in El Paso, Texas. She is currently an Army Black Hawk helicopter pilot stationed in Romania after a stint in Latvia. She will remain overseas for the majority of 2025.

John and Amanda. Couldn't be more different. Old vs young. Navy vs Army. Sea vs Air. One male. One female. Yet they like many others heard the call of duty and embraced the many challenges that are inherent to preserving our country's safety and security. On this Independence Day, we thank you and all the others, past and present, whose sacrifices have let us live our lives in safety and freedom.

# **Bites That Bug You!**

If you are bitten by a mosquito, take these steps to relieve the bite.

- Wash the bite with soap and water.
- Apply a cold compress or ice pack to reduce swelling and itching.
- Apply an over-the-counter antihistamine or anti-itch cream containing hydrocortisone to relieve itching.
- Take ibuprofen or acetaminophen to reduce inflammation and discomfort.
- Don't scratch the bite, since this can increase the risk of infection.

In most cases, mosquito bites result in minor irritation and go away on their own in a few days. But if you've been bitten by a mosquito and have any of these symptoms, see your primary care doctor: High Fever, Severe Headache, Body Aches, or spreading redness.
