

THE MORNING EVERYTHING CHANGED

One of the most captivating places on earth is the Church of the Sepulchre in Jerusalem, the place that is most recognized as the site of Jesus' own death and Resurrection.

It's been in the news a lot recently because it just recently underwent a major renovation. The original Church dates back to about the 4th century AD when the site was re-discovered by the Emperor Constantine's mother Helena. It's said that her companions also found the remains of Jesus' cross. That Church was mostly destroyed in a campaign to destroy Christian places of worship. The core of current Church structure goes back to the 11th century and we're still trying to take care of it today.

It's interesting when you think of it because a lot of what you're going to be looking at this Easter Sunday within our Church are encased in the walls of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. Instead of looking forward and seeing our large crucifix of Jesus accompanied by Mary and John, you have the actual Golgotha. Instead of the 14th Station at the left side of our humble parish Church, you have the actual tomb of Jesus. These are the places where Jesus was pierced, spat at, mocked, abandoned but still so desperately comforted by the people brave enough to be at His side. People like Mary, who we can say with confidence actually stood at places within that Church.

That tomb itself is right in the middle of the Church. People line up and venerate the place were Jesus' body lay, wanting just a minute with this holy spot.

I've never been there but a friend of mine spent the night locked in the Church (no Christian keeps the keys to the Church because the different denominations can't agree on who should carry it...one Muslim family has held that job since the 11th century). He told me about what it felt like to just hang out where Jesus died and was buried. It's a little overwhelming when you think of it: that the same image of the crucifix that we all grow up with first happened just a stone's throw away.

I feel great awe and a great deal of gratitude for that place and that so many people work so hard just so people like you and me can go visit it and offer our prayers.

But here's the thing...

Jesus isn't there.

In fact, Jesus is closer to you now than in Jerusalem this morning because you are here and so is He.

He's yours to talk to if you only you would close your eyes and say hello to Him.

His actual Presence is more complete in that Tabernacle underneath our statue of the Holy Family than it was hanging on the Cross at 3:01pm, at the minute after He died.

If you receive Him in the Eucharist, He is much closer to you than He was to Peter and John as they ran to and fro in their search for Jesus, searching His empty tomb and finding nothing.

He is so close to you right now. He's yours and you're His. In the Cross and the Resurrection God removed every obstacle standing between you and Him. Sin can't separate you from Him and neither can suffering. Distance can't separate you from Him and death certainly can't separate you from Him. If God wouldn't let a sealed tomb separate His Son from Himself, then He won't let anything separate you from Him either. Why? Because in our Baptism we became His sons and daughters too. He'll fight for us just like He fought death itself for His own Son.

Alleluia, my friends. He's here and He is risen.

SACRISTAN MINISTRY

Like <u>altar serving</u>, being a Sacristan is a very beneficial way to help out your church community, and an active way to participate in Mass. Sacristans perform the following duties:

• Setting up the church before Mass. Typically, sacristans arrive at church half hour before anyone else. They light the candles, arrange the books, ready the linens and basically perform a little simple organizing before Mass begins.



- Prepare the Holy Eucharist for the celebration of the Mass. This includes readying the wine, water and bread and putting them in place for the start of Mass.
- Coordinate all Mass participants, make sure Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers and Altar Servers are ready.
- Cleaning the holy materials after Mass in the sacristy.
- Before the sacristan leaves the church everything is set back in its place and secured.

Decide if this is something you think you can do. Setting the table of the Lord is a ministry that is essential for the Mass. We are in need of sacristans for all Masses. Our schedules are flexible so after training you can let us know what Mass works for you. Our schedule is posted ahead several months at a time for your convenience. *Please contact the Sacristan Coordinator Pat Rayball 708-9615 for more information*.
