

Where are we at?

Hi friends! So a couple of housekeeping notes:

So when will we have a new pastor?

For those of us who were at the Easter Vigil, we got a little bit of an update from Fr. David Berberian, who is the diocesan Vicar for Clergy and who works with the Bishop as well as priests who could potentially be placed with us.

Fr. Berberian let us know the evening of the vigil that an announcement would be just a few weeks away. That means that by the time you read this the announcement should be soon. As soon as we know we'll let you know! Keep up to date on our Facebook page, our website, or sign up for Flocknote to get news when we get it!

Is there anything else new?

We have a new Pastoral Associate for Business and Administration, Deacon Andrew Grebe, who serves as Deacon at St. Mary's Church in Crescent. He's replacing Ann McCauley, who is now the Pastoral Associate for Administration & Parish Life at St. John the Baptist in Valatie.

Deacon Andy has an important job and he was chosen from a pool of applicants with the input of Fr. Berberian, Ann, and our parish trustees (Mary Stewart and Stephen Green). He'll be working with everyone from our new pastor, our finance council, our school, our staff and beyond.

The strength of our community

At the Easter Vigil, Fr. Berberian said something else to us that bears repeating. He said that it was a real pleasure to pray at our parish, that it was a real testament to the parish that everything seems to run so smoothly, and that our new pastor will be in good hands. As a Church worker, I can attest that this is no small praise at an Easter Vigil, a

liturgy that requires a lot of care, concern, and attention to details.

Some conversations after the Vigil Mass got me thinking about all of the hard work that went into the various Holy Week liturgies and activities. They almost seem to magically happen and seem so effortless that I can always just show up, pray, and be drawn into the mystery of the Cross. As an employee, I get to see the behind-the-scenes work and I am just amazed by the way so many people come together to make these things happen. They all respond to something in their hearts that compels them to come and share what they have.

...and now that it's the Easter season...

...you'll notice now that the first readings at Mass will be from the New Testament book the Acts of the Apostles instead of one of the books of the Old Testament.

Acts of the Apostles is the Easter handbook. If for Lent you gave something up, maybe for the Easter season (which goes on until Pentecost, June 4th) you could make reading the Acts of the Apostles a personal goal. If you started today and read a chapter a day, you'd be done by May 21st.

The early Church, the first reading tells us today, "...devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of bread and to the prayers. . . All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their property and possessions and divide them among all according to each one's need."

In other words they put God first, they celebrated God's work in their lives together, and they took care of each other's needs. I think that it also describes how things were here not only in the weeks leading into Easter but at any time we get a chance to reflect on God's good work in our community.

SACRISTAN MINISTRY

Like <u>altar serving</u>, being a Sacristan is a very beneficial way to help out your church community, and an active way to participate in Mass. Sacristans perform the following duties:

• Setting up the church before Mass. Typically, sacristans arrive at church half hour before anyone else. They light the candles, arrange the books, ready the linens and basically perform a little simple organizing before Mass begins.



- Prepare the Holy Eucharist for the celebration of the Mass. This includes readying the wine, water and bread and putting them in place for the start of Mass.
- Coordinate all Mass participants, make sure Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers and Altar Servers are ready.
- Cleaning the holy materials after Mass in the sacristy.
- Before the sacristan leaves the church everything is set back in its place and secured.

Decide if this is something you think you can do. Setting the table of the Lord is a ministry that is essential for the Mass. We are in need of sacristans for all Masses. Our schedules are flexible so after training you can let us know what Mass works for you. Our schedule is posted ahead several months at a time for your convenience. *Please contact the Sacristan Coordinator Pat Rayball 708-9615 for more information*.
