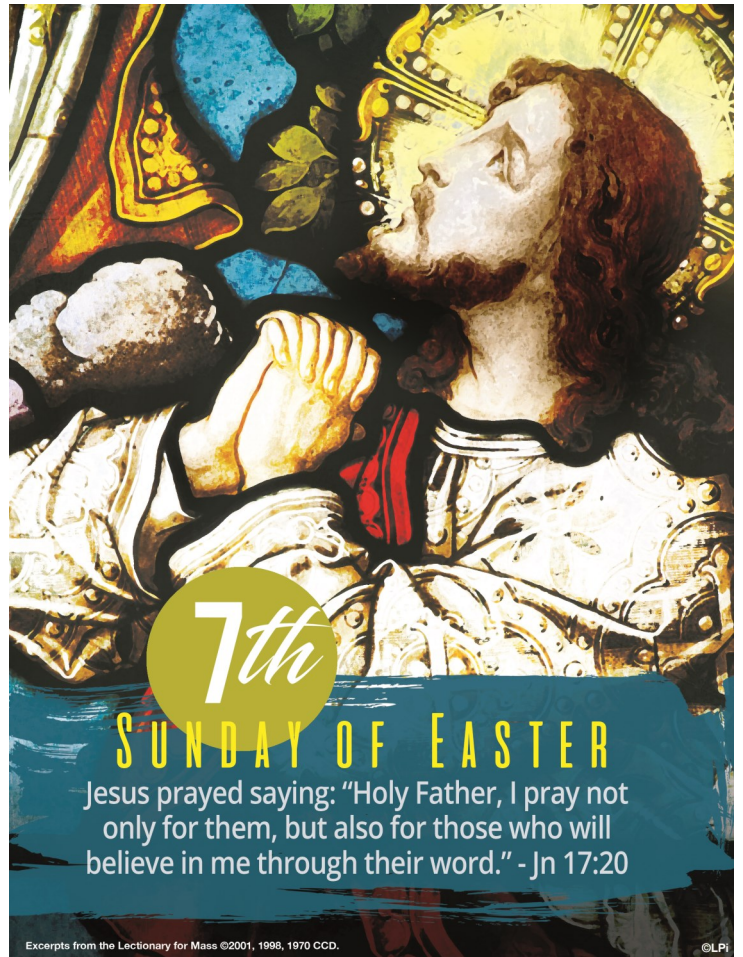

The year is almost over and our students have been busy learning many topics in Spanish. I am happy to say they

have done a great job with Spanish pronunciation which is music to my ears.

Depending upon the grade level they have learned The Sign of the Cross, The Our Father, The Glory Be and The Hail Mary.

Kindergarten and Pre-Kindergarten topics include learning to count in Spanish, colors, ocean creatures, weather symbols and body parts. They learned through a variety of means including songs, videos, flash cards and games.

Our 3rd grades learned numbers 1-100, colors, animals, weather, means of transportation and community places. 4th grades focused on number manipulation, math problems and telling time. They also learned about family members and parts of a house.

In 5th and 6th grade we learned basic grammar including pronouns, adjectives, infinitives and regular and irregular verbs.

I hope my students continue to practice Spanish! Have a blessed summer!
