

Ms. Schaffer's Pre-K 4 class celebrates Halloween

In conjunction with our Halloween theme, we explored fiction and nonfiction. We read *Go Away, Big Green Monster* by Ed Emberley and created a work of art that taught us about symmetry. We also made monster slime.

We read about ghosts and created our own ghost by blowing paint, and we shared what we would do if we were invisible. A couple of favorites were that they would sneak in to the kitchen and steal some cookies. Another said they would sneak up and scare their Grandma and Grandpa. Our STEM activity was to build a house for a ghost. We read *Room on the Broom* by Julia Donaldson, and designed a broom for the witch out of Legos. The final task was to share who you would have on your broom. Most wanted to have their families.

On Halloween, we carved a scary face out of our pumpkin and then made it erupt. We learned about chemical reactions.

We also tried to build a tower out of candy corn and design a boat that could float with candy corn in it.

Our nonfiction part of our theme was about bats and spiders. As part of our STEM activities, we created two kinds of bats. One bat was designed as a paper airplane and we attached a straw to the second bat, inserted a smaller straw inside the larger straw and blew to launch the bat. We determined the bat with the straw flew the best, and we then learned about spiders and their life cycles. The majority of our class is not afraid of spiders.
