

# Ms. Schaffer's Pre K-4 class celebrates the 100<sup>th</sup> Day of School

100 days of learning and fun. How do we celebrate this special day? We do everything the "100 way"!

We began our day by exercising and counting by 1's, 5's and 10's. The kids in Pre-K know the importance of exercise – it's great for your body and your brain too!

Over the February break the children were given a homework assignment whereby they had to return to school with a collection of 100 items that would fit in a brown paper bag. On the bag they had to write 3 clues for us to guess what was inside and present this to the class. This introduction to public speaking at an early age can help build self-confidence. The kids were very creative in the items they brought in – marshmallows, screws, nuts, bolts, pennies, etc. Our favorite items are the ones that we can eat – lollipops and candy kisses.

The students had to count and string 100 Fruit Loops onto a necklace. Father Kelly was kind enough to give Ms. Schaffer and her class some guidance; we could have used the help of Hailey Grace when it came time for clean up.

The fun continued as we worked in teams to see what we can build with 100 cups, cubes, craft sticks, links, and connectors. The children were given examples of what 100 can represent including weight, measurement, time and age to name a few. Our celebration ended with cupcakes and 100 balloons.
