Prek4-1 is now officially 100 Days Smarter! We had a fun day celebrating using the number 100 in a variety of ways throughout the day. Did you know that from our classroom to the spanish room is 100 steps!? In religion, we are learning about Lent and our 40 day journey. Each morning during Lent, the children pick a good deed stick. Some of the jobs can be completed in school and others need to be done at home. We are now learning about the age of Dinosaurs . We are pretending to be paleontologists as we dig in our sand table to uncover dinosaur fossils. We are using our math skills to graph the results to the question: What color were the dinosaurs and using our critical thinking skills to try to figure out why the dinosaurs are extinct. We will also be taking a look at our smartboard to understand how a fossil is formed . It's fun to identify each dinosaur according to their distinguishing characteristics- this will help develop our inferring skills in future grades.
