

We are starting a Catholic mom's group and we want YOU to join us.


ALL moms are welcome: trying mothers to empty nesters. There is so much to share and learn from one another at every stage.

SCHOOL UPDATE

Back with the Kids.

I have been loving seeing all of my students in person this year. I have been so excited to return to my past role of Academic Intervention Specialist (AIS) as well as teaching our oldest kiddos in 6th grade math and science. Last year was certainly full of fun and special moments as I taught our virtual learners, but there's nothing like teaching kids in the same room as you.

Many of my little learners enjoy the quiet, focused time they spend in my classroom as we work on new skills and practice skills from past years. We play games, read stories and do many activities to support these kids and their individual learning styles. While I have many students in my groups that I may have worked with in the past, I am getting to know new students and learn what motivates them.

My 6th graders are amazing. I have known many of them since Kindergarten. They are silly, caring and helpful individuals. It saddens and amazes me that we only have them with us for a few short months before we send them onto their next learning adventure. They have been working hard learning about the basic unit of life; cells. When I bring the microscopes out for them to explore, it is so exciting to see their faces light up with excitement and enthusiasm to use this tool to expand their learning. A couple weeks ago we even made cells out of candy. It was so fun to see them make connections between the text and interactive videos as we used jelly beans, sprinkles, jello, twizzlers, gumballs and a few other items to build our own model of a cell.

I have so much to be thankful for when I look at my students. The moment they step foot in my classroom, they become "my kids". There are few things greater in life than watching a child grow and I am blessed to see it every day with so many kids.
