## "Long live Christ the King"



In 1925, Blessed Miguel Pro was ordained a priest. He lived in Mexico but studied in Spain. At the time, Mexico had instituted a number of laws aimed at suppressing the Catholic Church.

Clergy were persecuted and regular people were limited in how they could practice their faith. Churches were closed and the clergy went underground. In 1926, he returned to Mexico to minister under these dire circumstances.

God would use Miguel's gifts in his ministry. As a child, Miguel was known for being good-humored. He was known for his practical jokes and brought joy to his family. As a priest, he found ways to minister to people creatively. Since he could not wear clerical garb publicly, he would wear disguises and exercise his ministry undercover. He would also provide for the needs of the poor.

Eventually, in November of 1927, he was caught and accused of an assassination attempt that he had no part in. He was condemned to die. As he was brought before the firing squad, he blessed those who were about to execute him. When he reached the place of his execution, he knelt down to pray. He refused a blindfold and as he stood before those who were to kill him, he stretched our his arms in the form of

the cross with a rosary in one hand and a crucifix in the other. He then exclaimed to the firing squad "May God have mercy on you! May God bless you! Lord, Thou knowest that I am innocent! With all my heart I forgive my enemies!" With his final words he shouted out "Viva Cristo Rey!" "Long live Christ the king!"

As we begin Advent, preparing for the arrival of our king, I think we would do well to remember what sort of king Jesus is. He does not exalt in earthly power and might but instead becomes the servant of all, humbly dying for the sins of the world. Blessed Miguel Pro modeled the life and death of his king, forgiving his persecutors and dying for a crime he did not commit, all out of love and service to Christ.

In our culture, we don't have absolute monarchs but rather elected officials. Still, with those positions come power and prestige. What would it look like if Jesus was our king? He models a very different sort of leadership. He washes the soles of his disciples' feet. He tells us that "the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many" (Mk 10:45). He

shows us a different way and shows us that the path to greatness is not in power but in service.

# PRAYER MINISTRY: COME HOME FOR CHRISTMAS — A NOVENA TO ST. MONICA

"First, it helps develop the daily habit of prayer; it reinforces a sense that God is our Father and that he loves us and it teaches us the benefits of praying with others to God. This is especially true when we participate in communal novenas such as those said in informal groups or ongoing novenas in parishes."

Come Home for Christmas will be our ongoing parish novena and will begin on Sunday, November 28th.

Please join us in prayer; simply pick up a prayer card at the entrances of the church and pray the novena daily! The 3rd cycle of the novena ends on December 24th, Christmas Eve. May our church be filled to overcapacity on Christmas and every day thereafter!
