MARCH 6, 2022 1ST SUNDAY OF LENT

Lent is here! What can we do as a parish to enhance our Lent?

First, I'd like to direct you to a weekly parish retreat that we're offering from 9:50am to 10:50am on the Sunday mornings of Lent. It'll be in the chapel (or the Church if there's overflow).

The retreat is called "Transformation" and we're going to explore the Sunday readings in light of our path to discipleship.

March 6th "To Change I Must Face the Voice of Temptation"

Here we'll discuss practical ways that you can hear God in your life.

March 13th

"To Change I Must Allow Myself to See God for Who He Really is"

An experience of God can forever change the course of our lives.

March 20th

"To Change I Must Not Let My Past Determine My Future"

Your story is not about your own failures but of God's victory in your life.

March 27th

To Change I Must Accept My Struggling Brother and Sister"

The Prodigal Son reveals the drama of sin and mercy within the context of a human family. Discover how this story reveals the God of mercy and how this can transform our selves, our families, and our community.

April 3rd

"To Change, I Must Hold a Mirror Up to Myself and Not Judge Others"

Judging comes easy to us yet Jesus presents a radical message on the nature of judgment.



What else can we do to enhance our Lent?

- Pray—Who wouldn't benefit from praying more? When we pray we communicate with God and give Him the space to speak to us. Think of one concrete step you can take to enhance your prayer life and make it something you can manage. If you don't pray at all, perhaps start by saying an Our Father slowly and intentionally at the beginning and end of each day. If you use memorized prayers, dedicate a time for God (for example, when you shower) where you can speak freely to Him and allow Him the silence to speak in your heart. - Fast—The idea of "giving something up for Lent" is still a mark for Catholics in our culture. We have special days to either fast (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday) or abstain from meat (Fridays in Lent). But by choosing to give something up we make a sacrifice and we believe that those sacrifices better unite us to Jesus on the cross. We can give up sinful habits that have been dragging us down or we may also give up good things as well. The hope is that by giving something up, we are more free to fill that time and energy with something good.
- Almsgiving— Almsgiving, or charity, is where we provide for the needs of others out of the good things God has given us. It reminds us that everything we've been given comes with a responsibility and that we may be the only way that relief comes to someone in need. You can give to our food pantry or towards the relief surfaces that the parish provides. You may also find a worthy charity or a local cause that could benefit from your help. Keep your eyes and heart open to the needs of others and God will show you where you can make a difference.
- Read the Bible—This can also be under prayer but I challenge you to read the rich readings offered at the daily and Sunday Masses!


