MARCH 20, 2022 3RD SUNDAY OF LENT

We are offering a weekly parish retreat from 9:50am to 10:50am on the Sunday mornings of Lent. It'll be in the chapel (or the Church if there's overflow).

The retreat is called "Transformation" and we're going to explore the Sunday readings in light of our path to discipleship.

March 20th (this Sunday)
"To Change I Must Not Let My Past
Determine My Future"

Your story is not about your own failures but of God victory in your life.

March 27th (next Sunday) To Change I Must Accept My Struggling Brother and Sister"

The Prodigal Son reveals the drama of sin and mercy within the context of a human family. Discover how this story reveals the God of mercy and how this can transform our selves, our families, and our community.

When I started working at St. Ambrose almost 9 (!) years ago, I was extremely nervous. I had just been working on Long Island for 5 years and there had been real benefits to working someplace where no one knew who you were. They didn't know my past, they didn't know how I worked, and there was no embarrassing baggage from my past. While I was on Long Island, all my mistakes and foibles were tucked away safely away in Latham, far away from the people I ministered to. By moving back here, people knew me at all stages of my life and that scared me.

In today's Gospel reading, we also meet someone with a past. Jesus meets a Samaritan woman at Jacob's Well, in Samaria. In the eyes of the world, she could do nothing right. She had been divorced and/or widowed 5 times and was currently living with someone out of wedlock. For whatever reason, she's gathering water at noon when the rest of the community would've gone early in the morning, showing that she'd been ostracized by her fellow villagers. To Jesus's disciples she was both a Samaritan (a people hated by Judeans like them) and a woman, making her not worthy of Jesus' time.

I can't do justice to the whole story in just one

page, but I encourage you to read through the story, carefully. Why did Jesus choose to engage this woman with one of his most mysterious teachings? A teaching that we're contemplating so many centuries later. In many ways, this woman was just the kind of person Jesus empathized with. She had been marginalized and she was unexpected. It's a sign to us that Jesus chooses who He wants and thinks little of the qualifications we impose on people.

Jesus speaks frankly of her sins but does not disqualify her. In fact, she announces to her town "Come see a man who told me everything I have done. Could he possibly be the Christ?" She goes to the place where she had been written off and reclaims her past sinfulness not as a place of divine abandonment but as the very place that the Christ came to meet her. She allows the story of her past to be the place where she evangelizes the community...and the community responds by encountering Jesus for themselves.

The idea of history is an important concept in the Bible. God's people are often called to narrate the history of their salvation. They would frequently tell stories of how God rescued them from their oppressors. But woven into those stories were occasions where God's people were not so faithful. Often, they fell into ruin because of the bad choices they had made. In the story of the rescuing, God includes a recognition that He saved us despite what we've done wrong. Righteousness (living and acting rightly) in the Bible is extremely important, but it's a concept usually juxtaposed with the reality that we tend to mess things up, often catastrophically. It's precisely at these moments that God can do His greatest work.

We all have a story. Some of us try to hide it. But try to tell the whole story..."I messed up, sometimes in terrible ways but I met Jesus and God had mercy on me anyway. I am who I am today because God met me where I was broken." If you can tell the whole story to yourself, maybe you can tell that story to someone else. Evangelizing doesn't need to be lofty theology and argumentation. Evangelization can just be telling your story.




