14TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Our Gospel reading has a message for you:

You are being sent on a mission.

You are probably woefully ill-equipped to do it.

You don't have enough resources, including time.

It is going to feel like it's somebody else's job to do it.

The mission starts from the pew you sit in at church, though it begins at home as well.

You already know where you're going but you have no idea where you might end up.

You might end up on streetcorners, you might end up at your job, you might end up with people in your family or you might end up at someone else's home.

You have a message to deliver and things that you must do.

This task was given to you by the Lord. It's a great responsibility because you've met him, you've been changed by him, and others haven't had that chance yet.

It would be far easier (and much more effective) if Jesus just did this job himself. But God always desires to use people to reach out to other people so here you are. He always picks imperfect people, illequipped people, and people with a past. If that's you then consider yourself called.

The stakes are high. The disciples report back to Jesus that "even the demons are subject to us because of your name" (Luke 10:17). Jesus then frames the disciples' actions of speaking to others and working deeds in Jesus' name within the context of a cosmic battle that ends with Satan falling from the heavens. This means that the words you use and the things you do have a far greater significance than you realize. They are bigger than your everyday

concerns or even the affairs of country and state. Your words and actions have a reach that goes as high as heaven or as low as hell.

So what's the message?

The message is the "Kingdom of God". It's announced by words and by actions. The realization of the Kingdom is a world where God reigns over every power of this world, whether it's government or nature. Is the world unfair? In the Kingdom, things are fair. Do the poor lack what they need? In the Kingdom they have what they need and more. Do people suffer? In the Kingdom suffering is relieved. Is there evil in this world that causes anxiety and strife? In the Kingdom that evil is expelled and people are left to live in peace.

This Kingdom is initiated by God. He gives the entire work of the Kingdom its strength through his grace. But the Kingdom is realized through you. It has to be you, no one else will do.

If you take on this mission, the world will be a better place. A part of heaven will surround your very presence and people will experience God's love and peace through you. If you don't take on this mission the world will be a sadder and poorer place.

How can you start this mission? Start with finding the problems, the places of suffering, division, and hatred and bring God's peace and love into them. Go where no one else will go. Have the conversations no one else will have. Love the people that no one else will love and do it all in Jesus' name. Sometimes you'll use his name. Many times you won't but they'll still know him by the presence of his love. Heal, give, talk, and do not be afraid. He made you to do this and he has your back.


