


Fight Against Suicide

Things of My Very Own is a not- for- profit group that tries to provide for immediate needs of infants, children and adults who are removed from abusive households. They typically leave with nothing but whatever they are wearing when removed. Friends in Faith decided to ask our parish family to help provide what they need when they are moved to a safe situation. Clothing is needed for newborns and infants, older children (esp. school clothes!) and adults. Gently used are fine. Boxer shorts are worn by boys and girls- many abused children want these very loose. (ALL UNDERWEAR MUST BE NEW). No more tears shampoo is best since some children have never had their hair shampooed. Soap, body wash, deodorant, toothpaste and brushes also needed. 
Psalm 103 The Lord is Kind and Merciful

Today, is the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A, with the designated Responsorial Psalm 103 and its response: "The Lord is kind and merciful." Psalm 103 is a psalm of praise that extolls the Lord's goodness, mercy and faithfulness. Gratefulness arises from all that God has done in our lives (vs.3-4). Even the Lord's chastisements are softened by his abundant mercy (vs.9-10).
