1ST SUNDAY OF LENT

Welcome to Lent everyone!

Today's Gospel reading might seem almost uneventful. For starters, Mark tells the story of Jesus' temptation in the wilderness by Satan without any of the details that you find in Matthew and Luke's Gospel. After that, Jesus proclaims a simple message.

But this simple message that Jesus proclaims is it. It's the entire program. It sets the stage for everything he's going to say and do throughout the Gospel story. Moreover, it's the heart of the entire Christian message. It's worth reflecting on Jesus' words: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel (Mark 1:15). It's four simple things and yet it's the entire Gospel.

"This is the time of fulfillment"

Judaism at this time is often portrayed as being in a period of expectation. People were hoping for something to happen. Scattered throughout the Hebrew Bible are the various hopes and dreams of the people, fueled by the promises of God. Many hoped for the coming of a great king anointed by God, a "messiah", who would overthrow the kings and rulers of the earth who had oppressed God's people Israel. Many also hoped for the culmination of the current age where God would rescue his people and vindicate them in the face of their enemies. They wanted things to get better and they wanted God to intervene in their story.

The word "time" in New Testament Greek is the term *kairos*. *Kairos* is not chronological time. A better translation might be season. It's not determined by the seconds and hours but by an entire atmosphere, just as our seasons are marked either by snow, growth, warmth, or the slow dying of nature. The Greek of the word "fulfillment" indicates that this season has already been fulfilled. We have now entered into a new season and that season is marked by the coming of Jesus. Things were one way before but now things are totally different. They look different and they feel different. Jesus is not just one prophet in a succession that have spanned Israel's history. It's a whole new ballgame.

"The kingdom of God is at hand"

The Kingdom is Jesus' central message and this is what marks the change in season. Here in Israel's history, things are marked by the rule of the oppressive Romans, just as it had been the Greek rulers before them, the Persians before them, the Babylonians before them, and so on and so forth going back to the oppression by the Egyptians. Jesus is saying that time is over. For God's people,

God is now the rightful ruler of his people and Jesus' teaching and miracles show us exactly how different this new Kingdom looks. The afflicted are healed, the poor have hope and are provided for, and things are governed by fairness and justice. This message might seem hard to reconcile with the reality of Roman rule (and the rule of our world's current leaders) but Jesus insists that their rule is only an illusion. In the community of God's people, things are different. It is why it is so important that God's people model a different way of life than that of the rest of the world. For us, the Kingdom is everything.

"Repent"

The Greek for "repent" is *metanoeite*. It means to turn your heart and mind around and to change the direction of your life. Moreover, the verb is an imperative. Jesus is urgently telling us to take stock of our lives, to evaluate how we're living in contrast to the goodness of the Kingdom, and to urgently make the necessary changes to live according to this Kingdom. The proclamation that God has now entered into our lives necessarily includes the call to repentance. God welcomes us as we are but even if you're a lifelong Christian, God is telling us that we must change what we're doing if what we're doing is wrong.

"Believe in the Gospel"

The word "believe" is also in the imperative form. It is not simply a matter of intellectual belief, to believe the right things about God. It's one thing to believe that something is true with our minds. It's another to live our lives according to the truth, to be faithful to that truth at all costs. For example, I can "believe" that I am married but belief in the Biblical sense means that every decision I make is with the awareness of how things impact my wife. It is not just "faith" but "faithfulness". What are we faithful to? To the Gospel, in Greek evangelion. Evangelion refers specifically to the glad tidings a king or emperor announces as official decrees. For us, these glad tidings are about God entering into the world as our Lord and our King. It is such a better way of living that we announce it with joy.

This is the heart of the Christian message. We ask the world to imagine a world where God has taken over. Then we show them that this is real in how we model the reality of the Kingdom in our own communities. Things should be more fair, more just, kinder, more welcoming, and more. If our community doesn't model these things then the message is even clearer: repent. Our repentance is not only a turn to good behavior. It's embodying the Kingdom to people who might not believe at all.



Lenten Gospel Acclamation

During Lent, the Gospel Acclamation takes on a special form, It is chosen from one of 8 refrains, (such as "Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ") followed by a verse. The refrains are all forms of praise to Jesus, and the verses are normally from the scriptures, and often from the Psalter. These replace the Alleluia and the verse that are used at this moment of the liturgy during the rest of the year.


While the practice reaches back in popular piety to probably the sixth century, we can thank Pope Alexander II (1061 - 1073) for the custom of dismissing the Alleluia for the period of Lent as a matter of law. This led to some very creative celebrations of putting the Alleluia away, including ceremonies of burial.




