Loving others with a wounded heart

What do you do when someone is randomly put on our heart and our mind? Do dismiss the thought? Wonder what that person is up to? Remember an encounter with the person? Do you pause for a moment and pray for that person?

An aunt of mine recently texted me that I came to her mind of the blue. She mentioned that her mother taught her that when someone is on your mind say a prayer for them. This is an occasion for them to receive needed grace. This idea is that God has put the person on your heart because they could use prayers from a sister or brother.

I have heard many times of spontaneous prayers being moments when the person was in need. My aunt's prayer came at a time when I was planning something and grace was definitely welcome. Plus, finding out that she had prayed for me helped me realize the grace at the moment.

Sometimes the person put on our heart is a person who has died. In the Church's long tradition she teaches of praying for the dead. In the twenty-fifth session of the Council of Trent, this reality is spoken of: "...there is a Purgatory, and that the souls there detained are helped by the suffrages of the faithful, but principally by the acceptable sacrifice of the altar..." Here we see the tradition of the Church to pray for the dead, especially with Masses celebrate for their intention. People often come by the rectory and request intentions for their deceased loved ones that grace be obtained for their purification and entrance into Heavenly glory.

I encourage you not to let the thought of someone, living or dead, go by without at least saying a little prayer for them. We may not find out the good the prayer does, but that does not mean that God's grace is not granted.

FIRST READING - Jeremiah 38:4-6,8-10

In those days, the princes said to the king: "Jeremiah ought to be put to death; he is demoralizing the soldiers who are left in this city, and all the people, by speaking such things to them; he is not interested in the welfare of our people, but in their ruin." King Zedekiah answered: "He is in your power"; for the king could do nothing with them. And so they took Jeremiah and threw him into the cistern of Prince Malchiah, which was in the quarters of the guard, letting him down with ropes. There was no water in the cistern, only mud, and Jeremiah sank into the mud. Ebed-melech, a court official, went there from the palace and said to him: "My lord king, these men have been at fault in all they have done to the prophet Jeremiah, casting him into the cistern. He will die of famine on the spot, for there is no more food in the city." Then the king ordered Ebed-melech the Cushite to take three men along with him, and draw the prophet Jeremiah out of the cistern before he should die.

Brothers and sisters: Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that

clings to us and persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith. For the sake of the joy that lay before him he endured the cross, despising its shame, and has taken his seat at the right of the throne of God. Consider how he endured such opposition from sinners, in order that you may not grow weary and lose heart. In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding blood.

Jesus said to his disciples: "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing! There is a baptism with which I must be baptized, and how great is my anguish until it is accomplished! Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? From now on a household of five will be divided, three against two and two against three; a father will be divided against his son and a son against his father, a mother against her daughter and a daughter against her mother, a mother-in-law against her daughter-in-law and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law."

Month of the Immaculate Heart of Mary...

The Church dedicates the month of August to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. It is a dogma of the Catholic faith that Mary is the Immaculate Conception; that is, in preparation for the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Holy Trinity in her womb, she was conceived without the corruption of sin through the infinite merits of her Son, Jesus Christ. Over the centuries, as saints and theologians reflected on how Mary pondered and treasured the sacred events from the life of Christ in her holy heart, as attested in Scripture, her pure heart was recognized as something to be imitated.

Devotion to Our Lady's purity of heart began to flower, so much so that in the 17th Century St. John Eudes promoted it alongside the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The devotion rose to a new level after the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima, when Mary revealed an image of her Immaculate Heart to Lucia, Jacinta, and Francisco.

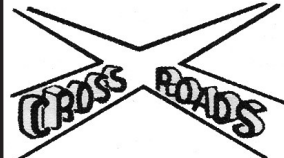
