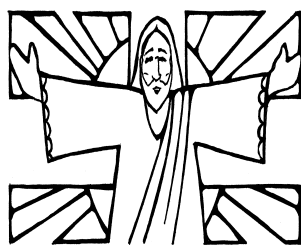

Bible Stories for Little Children



This weekend saw the first passing of the anniversary of the Roe v. Wade decision after its overturn last June. One may ask, "Then why are we still having Marches for Life?" The simple answer is that our work in defense of human life is not over. The overturn of this major case decision does not change the mind of society. The dignity of all human life is still not fully accepted. We must continue to work toward and build up a culture of life.

While we celebrate the reversal of the Roe v. Wade decision, we need to continue to pray for and encourage our lawmakers to uphold the dignity of life from, as we say, the womb to natural death. A deeper seeded battle is still afoot. Our work is toward a paradigm shift also in the minds of the people. Many of our people were born and grew up only knowing abortion's legal status. This has embedded the false idea that abortion is not only a right but a good even to the point of being called healthcare.

The paradigm shift we are working toward is that of support and walking with a pregnant mother and expectant father be they excited, scared, or worried about the pregnancy. We need to let them know they are not alone and that they are seen and treated as our sister and brother. "In a post-Roe world, then, we must shift the paradigm to what Saint Pope John Paul II described as 'radical solidarity,' making the good of others our own good, including especially mothers, babies (born and preborn), and families throughout the entire human lifespan. It is a call to friendship and compassion rooted in the truth that we are made to love our neighbor as ourselves" (Statement by Archbishop William E. Lori Chairman, USSCB Committee on Pro-Life Activities ion 2022). Let us continue to pray for the dignity of all human life and uphold it even in our hearts doing what we are called by God to do—love.

FIRST READING - Zephaniah 2:3,12-13

Seek the LORD, all you humble of the earth, who have observed his law; seek justice, seek humility; perhaps you may be sheltered on the day of the LORD's anger. But I will leave as a remnant in your midst a people humble and lowly, who shall take refuge in the name of the LORD: the remnant of Israel. They shall do no wrong and speak no lies; nor shall there be found in their mouths a deceitful tongue; they shall pasture and couch their flocks with none to disturb them.

SECOND READING - 1 Corinthians 1:26-31

Consider your own calling, brothers and sisters. Not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. Rather, God chose the foolish of the world to shame the wise, and God chose the weak of the world to shame the strong, and God chose the lowly and despised of the world, those who count for nothing, to reduce to nothing those who are something, so that no human being might boast before God. It is due to him that you are in Christ Jesus,

who became for us wisdom from God, as well as righteousness, sanctification, and redemption, so that, as it is written, "Whoever boasts, should boast in the Lord."

GOSPEL - Matthew 5:1-12

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain, and after he had sat down, his disciples came to him. He began to teach them, saying: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land. Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied. Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven."

Key Scriptural Passage:

Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people. (Matthew 4:23)

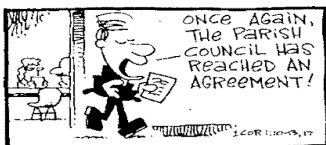

Matthew 4:12-23... The common call...

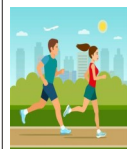

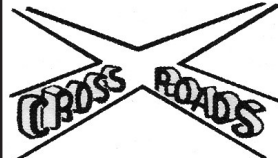
