The bishop, along with numerous priests and parishioners of the diocese, celebrated our annual Mass with the blessing of the seed and soil Saturday morning. The focus of this Mass is the many farmers within the Diocese of Victoria. We thank them for their hard work, which brings forth the various crops that supply so many. Every year, the bishop takes this Mass to bless the seeds that will be planted and the soil in which the seed is planted.

Living in a rural diocese such as ours affords us the benefit of greatly understanding the mind of the multitudes who heard Jesus preach and witnessed his miracles. I have, many times, counted the blessing of growing up in the Diocese of Victoria and felt a special kinship to the crowds that gathered around Jesus. He spent much of his life and ministry in the rural communities of Nazareth, Capernaum, Emmaus, Bethlehem, and around the Sea of Galilee all similar in size and livelihood to ours. Much of the life of the people revolved around raising animals and crops or harvesting the bounty of the sea.

To reach these peoples, Jesus purposefully spoke using examples of agriculture and teaching with parables using livestock and crops, landowner and tenant, and employer and employees. These were the stories that would have been most understandable and impactful to the farmers, shepherds, and fishermen. When we read Gospel passages or hear them proclaimed to us, we can easily enter into the mind of the original listener and hear Jesus as they would have. Much of the way he preached, speaks to us in our way of life experiences.

FIRST READING - Leviticus 19:1-2,17-18

The LORD said to Moses, "Speak to the whole Israelite community and tell them: Be holy, for I, the LORD, your God, am holy. "You shall not bear hatred for your brother or sister in your heart. Though you may have to reprove your fellow citizen, do not incur sin because of him. Take no revenge and cherish no grudge against any of your people. You shall love your neighbor as yourself. I am the LORD."

SECOND READING - 1 Corinthians 3:16-23

Brothers and sisters: Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person; for the temple of God, which you are, is holy. Let no one deceive himself. If any one among you considers himself wise in this age, let him become a fool, so as to become wise. For the wisdom of this world is foolishness in the eyes of God, for it is written: *God catches the wise in their own ruses*, and again: *The Lord knows the thoughts of the wise, that they are vain*. So let no one boast about human beings, for everything belongs to you, Paul or Apollos or Cephas, or the world or life or death, or the present or

the future: all belong to you, and you to Christ, and Christ to God.

GOSPEL - Matthew 5:38-48

Jesus said to his disciples: "You have heard that it was said, *An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth*. But I say to you, offer no resistance to one who is evil. When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well. If anyone wants to go to law with you over your tunic, hand over your cloak as well. Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go for two miles. Give to the one who asks of you, and do not turn your back on one who wants to borrow. "You have heard that it was said, *You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy*. But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what recompense will you have? Do not the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet your brothers only, what is unusual about that? Do not the pagans do the same? So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect."

Key Scriptural Passage:

Jesus said, "So when you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother or sister, and then come and offer your gift. (Matthew 5:23-24)
