

Gospel of Matthew: Much of the narrative of the Gospel of Matthew, as well as Luke, draw upon the earlier written Gospel of Mark. Matthew describes Jesus' mission not only about doing, but also teaching. At the beginning of his ministry, with the call of the apostles, Jesus, "...went around all of Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and curing every disease and illness among the people" (Mt 4:23).

Three verses later we see Jesus moved by the crowd gathered with him, and he begins teaching them. Matthew fills up three chapters describing the teachings of the Sermon on the Mount. "When Jesus finished these words, the crowds were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority, and not as their scribes" (Mt 7:28-29).

Jesus teaches and then heals. Matthew takes the next three chapters to tell of the various healings Jesus performed all the while continuing to teach because, "...his heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd" (Mt 9:36). Everywhere he went, Jesus coupled his miracles with a teaching lesson which drove the Truth deeper into the people's heart.

As his ministry nears its end, Jesus makes a shift to begin commissioning his disciples to take up the mission. Their teaching mission was localized to continue teaching the people of Israel. This was to prepare them for the great commission, which would come at the end of Matthew's Gospel when Jesus would send them to all nations. "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Mt 28:19-20a). The Gospel ends with Jesus' promise to be with us "...until the end of the age" (Mt28:20b).


