



Gospel of Luke: Luke broadens the net of Christianity and writes for a gentile audience. His focus is the people outside the house of Israel that they see the Truth is Christianity and convert. With the faith in its infancy in the world, Luke is concerned with demonstrating the legitimacy of Christianity and Christ as the architype of living life in God.

The Spirit takes a greater role in Jesus' ministry. After Jesus' baptism, Luke writes that Jesus, "filled with the Holy Spirit...was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days to be tempted by the devil" (Lk 4:1-2a). Luke begins Jesus' ministry in the synagogue of Nazareth where Jesus reads from the prophet Isaiah and then proclaims the fulfillment of this passage in him: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord" (Lk 4:18-19).

The savior coming with mercy and justice to bring the poor and outcast into the community is seen in the parables Luke presents such as the lost sheep, the lost coin, the lost son and the persistent widow, as well as, parables only found in this gospel—Lazarus and the rich man, the rich fool, and the good Samaritan. Luke's vision of the mission is that everyone come to see that Jesus has come for them and that they have faith in him.

Luke also writes a "second volume" to his work—Acts of the Apostles—where he continues the Spirit's work now through the apostles. The Spirit descends upon them and they pick up Jesus' mission to all the world. This mission is now our mission, which through Baptism we receive the Holy Spirit who prompts us to act in bringing the Gospel to the world.


