

In our world culture we can very easily get lost in our own self and overthink about the struggles that have come our way. We turn our gaze so tightly on ourselves that we begin to think of ourselves as an island that no one can possibly understand our plight. This only serves to deepen our gaze solely on ourselves. Which continues a vicious cycle of self-destruction. We need to break the cycle, or better yet, not enter it at all. As many billboards on the roadside say: "Jesus can help."

Pope Francis spoke how Jesus as the remedy and prevention in his address to the people on April 23 before the *Regina Coeli*. His words were on the encounter of the two men walking back to Emmaus with Jesus. These men realized after Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of the bread: "Were not our hearts burning [within us] while he spoke to us on the way and opened the scriptures to us?" (Luke 24:32). Jesus walked with them physically to Emmaus as well as spiritually through their struggles with the one they thought the Messiah and their disappointment at his death. The Holy Father, in his address, encouraged us to give a brief examination of the day with its successes and pitfalls. He stated, "Only in this way can he take us by the hand, accompany us and make our hearts burn again."

Like the men sadly walking back to Emmaus, our daily struggles can get us down, but Jesus can help reframe the day's events to celebrate the highs more and see the good God can bring out of the lows. God took the lowest of lows—Jesus' death—and created the highest of highs—humanities redemption. When we give our troubles over to God, He can bring good to our lives from them.

Growing in Faith... from Scripture...John 10:1-10; Trusting the Good Shepherd...

In this Scripture passage, Jesus used the image of a shepherd to reveal who He is, how He cares for us, and more importantly, how He want us to relate to Him. The image of a shepherd was a powerful choice.

A good shepherd knew each sheep in his care individually. He never left his flock. Many sheep-pens didn't have doors, so the shepherd would sleep in the entry way to prevent enemies from getting to his flock. Predators would have to go through him first. If a sheep got lost, hurt, or was attacked, the shepherd took care of it, even risking his life for the sheep. Jesus' illustration is clear. Without the constant care, guidance, and protection presence of the shepherd (God), the sheep (us) wouldn't survive. That's uncomfortable because it means we're dependent and vulnerable. But the deeper truth is that Jesus, our Shepherd, knows us each personally.
