Break-In at the Basilica by Dianne Ahern



Each cathedral has one, but many Catholics do not know its significance. Some may not even know it is special or even present. I am talking about the cathedra. You may be asking,

“The what?” And no I did not misspell the title of the church building. The cathedra is why we call a particular church building a cathedral.

The cathedra is the chair of a bishop placed in a cathedral church on which a bishop presides over solemn liturgies. It denotes the diocesan bishop's episcopal see. In essence, it is the chair from which the bishop guides his diocese, and symbolizes his role as shepherd and teacher of the faith. Usually large, weighty, and fixed in place, this chair signifies the large responsibility of the bishop for the souls in his diocese, and his commitment and stability to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Raising the chair gives it a prominence and speaks to the authority of the bishop as a successor to the apostles.

The symbol of the cathedra is so great that it is intended only for the ordinary—the bishop of the diocese. Other bishops may use it to preside over liturgies with the ordinary's permission. At the Mass of installation, the apostolic nuncio or another representative of the pope begins the Mass with a proclamation of the Apostolic Letter. The newly named bishop of the diocese is given all authority and rights essential of a diocesan ordinary. He is led to the cathedra, and upon sitting, becomes the bishop of the diocese.

Next time you visit Our Lady of Victory, or another cathedral, look for the cathedra and notice its placement in the sanctuary with this new knowledge. If you attend a Mass at OLV notice how a presiding priest will sit in a presider's chair behind the altar, while Bishop Cahill, if presiding, will sit in the cathedra on the sanctuary's right.

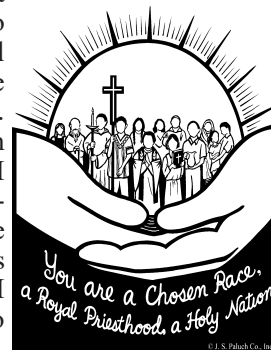
SECOND READING - 1 Peter 3:15-18

Beloved: Sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts. Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope, but do it with gentleness and reverence, keeping your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who defame your good conduct in Christ may themselves be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if that be the will of God, than for doing evil. For

Christ also suffered for sins once, the righteous for the sake of the unrighteous, that he might lead you to God. Put to death in the flesh, he was brought to life in the Spirit.

GOSPEL - John 14:15-21

Jesus said to his disciples: "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot accept, because it neither sees nor knows him. But you know him, because he remains with you, and will be in you. I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me, because I live and you will live. On that day you will realize that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you. Whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves me. And whoever loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and reveal myself to him."

A Prayer to Saint Isidore, Patron of Country People
